City Council/City Updates

*At its Work Session meeting beginning at 5:00 pm on July 26, 2016 your City Council will discuss: Gladstone Urban Renewal Plan Update, Charter Amendment Proposal, Roles & Responsibilities of Council Liaisons, City Committees, Boards & Commissions and Public Works Vehicle/Equipment Replacement Policy.

*Nuisance/Code Enforcement: The City administers a "nuisance code" that essentially prohibits conditions that may affect public health or safety, such as accumulations of debris or trash, storage of junk, obstructed clear vision at an intersection, tall grass or weeds, barking dogs, etc. Please call Code Enforcement at 503-479-6859 to report any concerns.

Utility (Water/Sewer) Billing Auto Pay

Residents have the ability to request their bi-monthly utility (water/sewer) bill to be automatically deducted from their checking or savings account. The authorization agreement for Auto Pay (ACH Debits) may be found on the City's website, www.ci.gladstone.or.us or by stopping by City Hall, Monday-Friday, 8am-5pm. Funds will be withdrawn on the DUE DATE only for the AMOUNT DUE listed on the billing statement. No alternative payment dates will be available. Residents must submit their completed form by August 5th to be effective for the July/August billing cycle.

Fire Hydrant Maintenance

Seasonal employees have started cleaning around and painting fire hydrants across our city. A three foot clear area in all directions around the fire hydrant is required by the Oregon Fire Code. Street frontage is expected to be 10 feet so every fire hydrant is clearly visible to approaching firefighters responding to emergencies. Please assist our work crew by trimming flowers and weeds, moving fences or trees the legal distance back from hydrant. For questions or concerns, contact Fire Marshal Mike Funk at 503-557-2775. Please remember to slow your car and move to the right when any emergency vehicle with lights and sirens approaches. Stop and hold while emergency vehicles are backing. Do not drive around, in front of or behind an emergency vehicle during a backing process.

*WW II Medals Found and Returned. Several WW II medals were recently found in a Gladstone home and have now been returned to the family of veteran Lt. Col. Frank Wilson, thanks to the work of Officer Eric Graves and his effective utilization of social media. The medals were returned to Wilson's great niece Nancy Wilson and she will be ensuring they are delivered to Wilson's daughter, Bliss who lives in Mexico. According to his family, Lt. Col. Wilson served our country for 22 years in World War II, Korea and Vietnam. The medals found included a Purple Heart and a Bronze Star. We'd also like to thank all those who assisted Officer Graves in finding Wilson's family members and VFW members who joined us for the return of the medals to Nancy Wilson.

City Council / Mayor Elections

The City Council is an elected policy decision-making body for the City of Gladstone. The council serves with an equal number of "lay members" on the Budget Committee and hears land use appeals of decisions made by the Planning Commission. Council members also serve as liaisons on advisory boards and commissions. Four-year terms of Mayor and City Council positions #2, #4 & #6, held by Thomas Mersereau, Linda Neace, Neal Reisner and Kevin Johnson, respectively, will expire 12-31-2016, except for the Mayor position. Due to the previously elected Mayor's resignation, the election of the Mayor's position is only for the remainder of the term, which will expire 12-13-2018. If you are interested in being a candidate, you must be a registered voter and have resided in the city for twelve months immediately preceding the election on November 8, 2016. A nomination petition or declaration of candidacy must be filed between July 11 and August 30, 2016. Grand Marshal—Diana Sharer

Diana Sharer, a.k.a. "The Elvis Lady of Gladstone" is the 2016 Community Festival Grand Marshal. Diana has been a Gladstone resident since 1972. Three of her four children, as well as three of her six grandchildren, graduated from Gladstone High School and currently two of her three great-grandchildren attend school in Gladstone. During the month of August, she will celebrate her 84th birthday. If you ask her, Diana will tell you that she has liked Elvis ever since the first time she saw him perform on the Ed Sullivan show in 1956. Her love of Elvis could easily be described as a passion and is well represented by the myriad of Elvis memorabilia placed decoratively throughout her home. In fact, she often jokingly refers to her home as 'Graceland West'. And speaking of Graceland, she has visited the Elvis shrine a total of five times. Her love of all things Elvis carried over to her family. Her son, Rod Sharer, dressed in thematic Elvis costumes, performs Elvis tribute music regularly at local venues, including the Gladstone parade. Her great-granddaughter and namesake, Diana Sammis, shares her love of Elvis and can often be heard crooning out an Elvis song, complete with the Elvis sneer. Diana has been a part of the Gladstone parade since 1980.
