TRAFFIC AND SAFETY COMMISSION MEETING
6:30 P.M., MAY 23, 2016
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1. The meeting was called to order and led by Michael Villanti (Chair.) Self introductions were made. Commission members present in the room were Linda Cosgrove, Kenneth Moore, Yvonne McNeil, Kirk Stempel (also Fire Dept. and Planning Commission), Libby Pace Wentz. Also present were Mike Funk (Assistant Fire Chief), Denise Browning (Guest), Jim Whynot (Director of Public Works), Neal Reisner (City Council liaison).
2. Request for Head in Parking & Painted Lines in Cul-de-Sac Located at 17235 Valley View Rd.: Denise Browning brought a letter of request and shared her concerns regarding the parking in this area. Denise paid her fine and is planning to attend traffic court. She has talked to her neighbors in the circle and they are also requesting head in parking. Mike Funk advised against head in parking as it may prevent emergency vehicle access. Per Jim, funding may not be available for painting pavement lines. This may also set an undesirable precedence for other areas in the City. Denise will send an email to Chief Jolly for his opinion. City ordinance indicates parallel parking only. To be held until next month for a final decision.

3. Election of Vice Chair: We are losing Linda Neace as she has moved on to a City Council position. Thank you Linda for all of your support while you were with us. Yvonne Mc Neil volunteered and was approved as the new Vice Chair.
4. Approval of April 25, 2016 minutes completed. The minutes were reviewed and approved.
5. Letter of Appreciation and Thank You from Pamela Orrell: The new signage and painted parking spaces at Portland Ave. and Gloucester Streets have now been approved by Council. Neighbors have been notified and Jeff has answered questions of concern. Signs have been ordered and will be installed within about one month.
6. Continued Discussion of Expansion of T.S.C. Duties & Possible change to Public Safety Advisory Commission: To be continued next month.
7. Update on Right Turn Sign From Arlington on 82nd. Jim has replaced the sign on the original post.
8. Continued Discussion of Truck & Truck Routes on Arlington Street: Jim indicates that signs are posted appropriately and Jeff has stopped a couple of vehicles on Arlington. This is not a truck route.

9. Signage on Portland Ave. Near High School Which Has Not Been Posted as a School Zone: Ken offered a copy of a statistics report showing that most vehicles are driving at appropriate speeds. No new signage will be posted at this time.
10. Blinking Yellow Light: Should educational information be created and presented to the public? Yvonne has done a computer search for instructions/standards regarding how divers should approach and pass through a blinking yellow light. Clear instructions were not found. To be discussed again next month.
11. Discussion of W. Clackamas Blvd. Becoming One Way Street and the Posting of No Parking Signs: Final decision has been made indicating that this will not be changed to a one way street. There will be postings of No Parking signs at the narrow widths of the street to ensure that fire trucks are able to pass in the event of an emergency. This will also solve the lack of good visibility in certain areas. Mike and Jim will determine where the signs are posted, order them and report back to us at the next meeting.
12. Installation of Traffic Light at Gloucester & Oatfield Road: Kirk reminded us of the increased traffic congestion in this area. All are in agreement that the increased traffic

congestion is problematic. The wiring and other structures needed are present. There was an agreement with the S.D.A. camp to pay for the installation of a traffic light at the intersection at Gloucester and Oatfield Roads. Jim will research this contract with the S.D.A and bring it back next month for further discussion. Cost will also be discussed.

13. Business from City Staff: Per Jeff, no new business.

14. Red Flex for Traffic Survey: Per Ken, this is expected to be done next week. Reports should be available next month.

15. Congratulations to Jeff Jolly as our new Police Chief.

16. Changes: Neal Reisner announced that he will no longer be our liaison to City Council. Thank you Neal for all of your help and support. Kevin Johnson will come to next month's meeting. Linda Neace has been appointed to City Council and her vacant seat has been posted for applications.

17. From Gladstone City Newsletter: The City has entered into an IGA with Oregon City on right of way management and geographic information services and right of way ordinances. I messaged TSC asking what this meant for

the City and for the residences of this city. Chief Jolly responded. "The IGA for right of way is in regard to utilities using public owned properties, roads and such without paying for that privilege. This will allow Gladstone to capture fees for these companies (as many as 60) that run services underground.

17. The meeting was adjourned by Michael Villanti. Next meetings are scheduled for June 27, July 25, August 29, September 26, October 31 and January 30, 2017. All at 6:30 p.m. No meetings are scheduled for November or December.
