## AGENDA ITEM

Update to the Gladstone City Council on the voter-approved Public Works Facility.

## History/Background/Proposal

In November 2021, Ballot Measure 3-570 City of Gladstone; Authorization to Construct and incur Debt for Public Works Facility was approved. The City retained a project manager, borrowed the funding and is in the process of completing Phase I of the Progressive Design-Build Project with P\&C Construction/Scott Edwards Architects. Staff will be coming to the City Council at the February 14, 2023 meeting to consider approving the Guaranteed Maximum Price contract for the completion of the project. This work session is intended to educate members of the Council on the project.

Please see the memo from Project Manager Kim Knox included in this packet, for more information.

## Cost Impact

In 2022 the City approved Resolution No. 1206 authorizing the City to borrow $\$ 5,000,000$ of full faith and credit backed financing for the project and use those proceeds to finance the project and pay costs related to the financing. The terms and allocation are as follows:

## SUBJECT: Gladstone Public Works Project - Project Status Update

The following provides a status update for of the Gladstone Public Works Project ("Project").
On August 9, 2022, the Gladstone City Council authorized the Design-Builder Team of P\&C Construction and Scott Edwards Architecture (SEA) to advance Phase 1 Project Design and Pricing services for the Gladstone Public Works facility.

Phase 1 work included preparation of a Preliminary Design and a Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP) proposal for Council consideration and approval prior to commencing Phase 2 work.

On October 27, 2022, the Design-Builder Team issued a 50\% Preliminary Design and Pricing Package consistent with the program and project description represented to the public during bond measure communications. The 50\% Package incorporated:

- Programming and design refinements
- Onsite structural, mechanical and electrical observations
- Building code evaluation
- County and City Engineer pre-application comments regarding utilities and site development
- Pricing based upon these assumptions

The 50\% Preliminary Design Package presented to Council in November 2022 exceeded the approved budget. Council authorized proceeding to $100 \%$ Design with the understanding that the team would pursue scope and pricing adjustments to ensure the project remains within budget while aligning with representations made to voters during the bond approval process.

Since then, the Design-Build Team and city have worked collaboratively to advance a $100 \%$ DesignBuilder Proposal that meets both of those thresholds. The Proposal is scheduled for Council consideration on February 14, 2023.
