Solid Waste Regulation & Rate Setting

- Gladstone Ordinance 1383
 - Establishes Franchise with Gladstone Disposal
 - Financial statement annually prepared for Gladstone
 - Annual review is done by Clackamas County
 - Rate Considerations include
 - Cost of performing service
 - Anticipated increases in cost
 - Reasonable Operating Margin
 - Comparable rates of other cities

Proposed Rates

Proposed 10% rate adjustment


- Residential user cost implications +\$3.06 monthly for a 35-gallon cart size (61% will see this increase or less)
- Commercial user cost implications +\$19.42 monthly for a 2 Yard container size (47% will see this increase or less)

Rate Adjustment Reasons

- Additional increase of \$8.30 per ton or 7.2% in 2022 plus an additional increase in 2023 of \$13.85 per ton or 11.2% (Gladstone accounts for over 7.5K tons annually)
- Fuel price increased \$1.23 per gallon in 2022 (Gladstone routes use 28K gallons annually)
- Recycle markets flipped Gladstone recycle costs increased \$41K in 2022
- Consumer Price Index increased by 6.5% in 2022
