*Phone Scam Alert—Don't be a Victim! Phone calls to residents claiming to be the IRS are picking up again. The call will say there is a warrant for your arrest unless you pay your back taxes and then ask you to purchase prepaid credit cards. THIS IS A COMPLETE SCAM. The IRS will not call you and tell you there is a warrant for your arrest unless you pay. Ignore the call and remember it's generally **never a good idea to give out personal information over the phone**. *Gladstone Police DUII Patrols: GPD conducted additional patrols over the New Year's holiday focusing on getting drunk and distracted drivers off the road, resulting in several DUII citations issued. Officers remind drivers it's always a good idea to drive at a speed appropriate for road conditions, know the speed limit for the road you're on, avoid distractions (no texting), wear seatbelts and secure children in properly-fitted child restraints. Make smart & safe choices when you get in your car and do the right thing for your passengers, yourself and others on the road. Please be aware additional DUII patrols will take place around the Super Bowl, which is February 7th. Start your party planning now and decide who will be the designated driver so everyone gets home safely!

Gladstone Fire Dept. (GFD) News

*Happy New Year: This winter is a great season for reflecting on the past and preparing for a safe new year. Why not make a commitment to improve your fire safety awareness in 2016? Gladstone firefighters responded to 1577 calls for assistance in 2015. Please assist us with our prevention efforts to keep your home safe by performing the following simple steps: 1) Always dispose of fireplace ashes in a metal bucket, and place it outside away from any combustibles and never keep the ashes in your garage until disposal day. Never us a paper bag or a plastic bucket for your ashes-they have a history of starting accidental house fires. 2) Candles can be beautiful, but are one of the leading causes of residential fires recorded in 2015. Please never leave your candles unattended. Be sure candles are in an approved holder and in a safe location. Many times pets or children can accidentally knock them over during day to day activities. Remember the new flameless candles are a safe option. They produce a flickering light with no open flame. 3) Smoke Alarms: Why mention smoke alarms again? Because people did not take the time to inspect or replace alarms since the last notice reminding all residents to check their home smoke alarms. Remember, ONLY working smoke alarms save lives! 4) Emergency response is sometimes delayed due to poor addressing. Be sure the fire department can read your house numbers. A minimum of 4 inch letters on a contrasting background is current code. Don't forget to illuminate them-with today's energy efficient LED lights you can afford to leave the light on for safety & number visibility. Charter Review Advisory Committees

The City Council is accepting applications from residents to serve on the City and Urban Renewal Charter Review Advisory Committees. The City's Charter has not been reviewed in over 20 years. The committee will review the current City Charter and make recommendations to City Council on revisions/updates to the Charter. With Council approval, those recommendations will be prepared for the Ballot for a vote of the people. Applications are available at City Hall or on the city's website at www.ci.gladstone.or.us. Applications must be returned to City Hall by noon on Monday, January 25, 2016 for appointment by the City Council at their January 26, 2016 meeting.

Business License Renewal Reminder

Business license renewals are due January 31st. All businesses pay a fee of \$100, plus \$5 per employee, and if the business is operating out of a home residence, an additional \$50 fee is required. For owners of rental properties, the \$100 fee applies plus an additional \$25 per rental property. Business license applications may be downloaded from the city's website at www.ci.gladstone.or.us. Business license fees not paid on or before March 1st will be assessed a delinquent charge of **\$10 per month.**

Security Alarm Permits Required

Effective January 1, 2016 security alarm permits will be required for any homes/ businesses with security alarms located within Gladstone City limits. The annual cost for the permit is \$25. Blank forms may be downloaded from the city's website at www.ci.gladstone.or.us or picked up

Utility (Water/Sewer) Billing Updates

*Residents now have the ability to have their bi-monthly utility (water/sewer) bill automatically deducted from their checking or savings account. The authorization agreement for Auto Pay (ACH Debits) may be found on the City's website, www.ci.gladstone.or.us or by stopping by City Hall, Monday-Friday, 8am-5pm. Funds will be withdrawn on the DUE DATE only for the AMOUNT DUE listed on the billing statement. No alternative payment dates will be available. Completed forms must be returned by February 5th to be effective for the January/February billing cycle.

*At its meeting on January 12th, the City Council approved master fee increases. This included an increase to mailed late notice/shut off notification fees. The rate increased from \$5.00 to \$7.00.


Gladstone Soccer Association
