City Council/City Updates

*The regularly scheduled July 12th City Council meeting has been rescheduled to Wednesday, July 20th at 6:30 p.m. *Gladstone Public Works Summer hours: Monday-Friday, 7:00 am to 3:30 pm. Hours will return to Monday-Friday, 8:00 am to 4:30 pm on November 7, 2016. *City Offices will be closed on Monday, July 4th in observance of Independence Day and will reopen on Tuesday, July 5th. At the June 14th City Council meeting, your Council: 1) approved the 2016-17 Budget; 2) Awarded a contract to Johnson Economics for the Creation of the Downtown Revitalization Plan. The Council is recruiting applicants to serve on a five-member advisory committee to assist with development of the Gladstone Downtown Revitalization Plan. Please take time to review this information. Then begin to take action for your water needs so you are ready in case of an emergency.

Gladstone Fire Dept. (GFD) News

*Last month Gladstone Fire & Police personnel spent time teaching hands-only CPR to the entire Senior Class at Gladstone High School. Hands-only CPR is a new method being taught to members of the public that doesn't require mouth-to-mouth breathing and encourages bystanders to start CPR in the event of cardiac arrest. As of January 2016 all students in Oregon are required to be trained in CPR in order to receive a high school diploma. Gladstone firefighters upgraded their own training and now perform "high performance CPR" when responding to cardiac arrest calls. HP-CPR techniques require the efforts of multiple firefighters to ensure that CPR is performed continuously with only occasional 4-5 second breaks when electrical shocks are being delivered to the patient by EMT's. Gladstone firefighters and EMT's work closely with ambulance paramedics from AMR to ensure the best possible care for patients in cardiac arrest. A free CPR smartphone app called "PulsePoint" is now available in Gladstone Fire Dept's response area and most other parts of Clackamas, Washington & Multnomah Counties. The PulsePoint app enables subscribers who have indicated they are CPR trained to be alerted to a cardiac arrest event simultaneously with firefighters and ambulance paramedics. The app uses sophisticated location-based services to alert citizens of the need for CPR in a public place, and directs them to the exact location of the nearest public access automated external defibrillator (AED). The free PulsePoint app can be found in the Apple App Store or in Android Apps on Google Play. In addition to cardiac arrest incidents, the PulsePoint app also pro-vides a virtual window into Gladstone's Fire emergency activity. Users can view active incidents and dispatched units, & pinpoint incident locations on an interactive map. Users also can choose to be notified of incidents by type and monitor emergency radio traffic via this modern version of the traditional fire scanner. The City Council is an elected policy decision-making body for the City of Gladstone. The council serves with an equal number of "lay members" on the Budget Committee and hears land use appeals of decisions made by the Planning Commission. Council members also serve as liaisons on advisory boards and commissions. Four-year terms of Mayor and City Council positions #2, #4 & #6, held by Thomas Mersereau, Linda Neace, Neal Reisner and Kevin Johnson respectively, will expire 12-31-2016, except for the Mayor position. Due to the previously elected Mayor's resignation, the election for the Mayor's position is only for the remainder of the term, which will expire 12-31-2018. If you interested in being a candidate, you must be a registered voter and have resided in the city for twelve months immediately preceding the election on November 8, 2016. A nomination petition or declaration of candidacy must be filed between July 11 and August 30, 2016. 2016 Dahl Beach Park Construction

The City of Gladstone is working with partners to improve Dahl Beach Park for visitors and wildlife. Projects include creating fish habitat at the confluence of the Clackamas & Willamette rivers, shoreline restoration and bulkhead removal. Construction will occur July 1-August 31, 2016, specific area impacts include: *Weekday only beach closure for the Clackamas River Confluence Restoration: July 15-August 5, 2016; *Reduced parking at Dahl Beach parking lot area: August 8-31, 2016; *Reduced parking above Bulkhead removal area: July 1-31, 2016. The project will enhance the park's safety by removing a failing bulkhead, removing armoring, asphalt and concrete in the floodplain, grading and reinforcing the shoreline and planting native trees & shrubs. Please keep safety in mind during the 4th of July holiday. If you purchase fireworks from a 4 stand in Oregon, they're legal. If the firework explodes, flies into the air, behaves in an uncontrollable & unpredictable manner or travels more than 6 feet on the ground or 12 inches in the air, it's illegal in Oregon. The dispatch center will be overwhelmed with fireworks-related calls and will appreciate your help if you call 9-1-1 to report fireworks issues ONLY if they pose a direct & immediate danger to property or persons. Also remember to be veteran & pet sensitive-fireworks can be frightening to animals & near torture to some of our war veterans.
