*Your City Council has approved an Intergovernmental Agreement with the City of Oregon City on Right Of Way (ROW) Management and Geographic Information Services (GIS). City staff is in the process of working with Oregon City officials to move forward with consideration of approving the Right of Way ordinance. A Council work session is scheduled for 5pm on May 24th. *The Charter Review Committee is working on updates to the Gladstone Charter. Recommended amendments to the Charter will be on the November ballot *The Oregon Liquor Control Commission (OLCC) has advised a new retail liquor store may be located at 20102 McLoughlin Blvd. Following a 14-day public posting, OLCC will make a final review before final approval. Gladstone Fire Dept. (GFD) News

There have been a number of inquiries lately concerning outdoor burning. Gladstone is situated within the Metro-DEQ no burn area, outdoor burning is generally not allowed, however, there are provisions that allow for small recreational or cooking fires. Recrea-tional fires are small fires contained to a commercial patio pot, burn pit or stove. Fuels used in these situations are restricted to clean seasoned firewood. Under no circumstances do recreation fire guidelines allow the burning of garbage, grass, leaves, twigs, yard debris, plastic, tires, petroleum products, construction debris or other product that releases offensive smoke or odors into the surrounding area. A recreational fire needs to b

e attended at all times. Have a method to extinguish fire quickly if needed, such as a fire hose, bucket of water or shovel with dirt or sand. Remember should a fire get out of control, you can be held responsible for damages caused. High Rocks & AMR Lifeguard Program

High Rocks Park is approximately 1.5 acres in size with the Clackamas River bordering Gladstone and Oregon City, and is a popular place for people to escape the heat or just to enjoy a family outing. High Rocks has seen many fatalities over the years that could have been prevented with a life jacket or a little bit of education on the dangers of the cold and fast water. The Clackamas River in the High Rocks area hides many dangers including strong currents, extremely cold water, large underwater rocks, and large pieces of scrap steel. Some of these items are barely under the surface where many people jump from the rocks, while river temperatures range from the mid-40 degrees in the winter to mid-60 degrees in the summer. This year we had a tragic incident early in April where a 21-year old swimmer became incapacitated due to the cold water temperatures and was found by divers two hours later. After numerous drownings over the years, American Medical Response (AMR), our local ambulance company, brought their River Safety and Rescue Program to our local waterway in 2002. Even with AMR Lifeguards on duty from Memorial Day to Labor Day, there are those situations that require additional resources or a "full marine rescue". The Clackamas Water Rescue Consortium, including Gladstone Fire Department, responds to incidents that require specialized rescue including divers, swift water swimmers, and boat operations. Gladstone Fire and Clackamas County recently met to discuss ideas on public outreach programs to help reduce fatalities and injuries that have been seen at High Rocks over the years. Examples of programs discussed were more signage, videos and photos of underwater obstructions, public service announcements and public forums. Please be safe as you enjoy High Rocks Park this year and remember to have a healthy respect for the dangers of swimming in this area.

Clackamas & Willamette River Restoration

Dahl Beach Park will be the location of several fish habitat restoration projects this summer. The Clackamas Confluence Project, located in the Dahl Beach forested natural area, will excavate off-channel areas and place large wood structures behind the beach to improve fish habitat on the Clackamas River. The Dahl Beach Mitigation Project removes a failing bulkhead and a portion of a parking area in the Willamette River floodplain along with improvements that will stabilize the bank, prevent erosion and create wildlife habitat along the river's edge. Project construction will occur between late June-end of August 2016, during which time beach and park access may be limited. Stay tuned for more information to be posted on the city's website. 
Bottle & Can Fundraiser
