Public Works News: Public Rights of Way

Gladstone Municipal Code Chapter 17.46.020(7) states: " Land within the public road right-ofway, not developed as sidewalks or driveways, shall be landscaped and maintained by the abutting property owners. Landscaping will be of the variety that would not create a road hazard or impair sight distance." What that means to residents—the City is responsible to maintain the public streets within the public right-of-way. However, landscaping & private signage, such as trees, shrubbery, subdivision entrance signs, ground cover, etc. is the responsibility of the abutting property owners. Some subdivisions have homeowners associations or neighborhood associations which have established fees to maintain their landscaping in the entrance medians. Others do not have homeowners associations so the responsibility of costs to maintain their median falls to individual property owners within the subdivision. While the City has previously performed minor maintenance to subdivision entrance medians, Public Works cannot justify the use of public funds & manpower to maintain private property established within the public right-of-way. Our focus must be on the immediate & critical needs of the City's public water, sewer, storm, streets & parks that serve all of our residents.

Leaf Pick Up Reminders

The Public Works Dept. would like to remind residents that public works will not pick up leaf piles that contain limbs or other debris. Residents are asked to put their leaves in the street no earlier than one day prior to scheduled pick up and allow six inches of drainage space between leaves and the curb to avoid stormwater flooding. Also, to avoid flooding, please help clean catch basin grates whenever they become covered with leaves. Please place small piles of leaves in your yard debris container. Additional maps/tentative schedule dates are available at City Hall or on the city's website, www.ci.gladstone.or.us. Please note the pick up dates are tentative based on the public works department work load.

Holiday Shopping Safety Tips—Here are a few reminders of things you can do to stay safe this holiday season: *if you shop at night, park in a well-lit area; *plan to shop with a friend, especially at night (there's safety in numbers); *do not leave packages or valuables where they can be seen in your car; *locate your keys before you leave the store so you can easily & quickly get in your car; *keep a secure hold of your purse & parcels—do NOT put them down to open the car door; *think of carrying a cross-body purse and be sure to keep every handbag zipped/closed so someone cannot reach in and grab your wallet; *avoid carry large amounts of cash—use checks or credit cards whenever possible & save those receipts; be sure to keep a record of all credit card numbers at home in case something ends up missing; *pick-pockets may work in pairs or groups so beware of strangers approaching you; *menkeep your wallet someplace other than your back pocket as it is easy to grab; *stay alert to your surroundings-don't just pay attention to your cell phone. Keep your head up and use common sense to stay safe this holiday season!

November 8, 2016, ballot measure results: *Measure #3-481 -Shall Gladstone prohibit medical marijuana processors, redical marijuana dispensaries, recreational marijuana producers, processors, wholesalers, and retailers in the City? Failed. *Measure #3-492- Shall Gladstone impose a three percent tax on the sale of marijuana items by a retailer? Passed. *Measure #3-506 -Shall Gladstone amend its Charter to require yeter approval to remove "park" designations. ter to require voter approval to remove "park" designations for City-owned property? <u>Passed.</u> *Measure #3-505- Shall Gladstone amend its Charter to require voter approval for the sale or lease of City-owned parks? Passed. *Measure #3-511- Shall the City of Gladstone adopt a new home rule charter? <u>Failed</u>. *Measure #3-512- Shall the City of Gladstone's mayoral term be four years? <u>Passed</u> (moot- as 3-511 failed). Ready for Snowy, Icy Winter Weather?

When wintery weather blows will you be ready? It's time to take action now before the bad weather sets in. Find your snow shovel and place it close to where you will need it & make sure you have a good supply of de-icing compound. Check the antifreeze level in your car, replace older batteries, check your tires for proper inflation and keep the gas tank near full to avoid freezing water in the fuel line. Things that could come in handy if you get stuck on the road: bags

of sand or non-clumping cat litter, an ice scraper, jumper cables, tire chains, flares or reflective triangles, blanket, flashlight & batteries, a gallon jug of drinking water, jacket, hat, gloves, socks & sturdy shoes/ boots, first aid kit and always travel will your cell phone fully charged so you can call for help if needed.
