The GFD is currently recruiting for on-call firefighters. Job qualifications required: \* high school diploma or equivalent; \* must be a minimum of 18 years of age; \* must pass a criminal background check and drug test; \*must possess a current, valid Oregon driver's license and maintain a driving

record insurable by the City's insurer to drive a department vehicle; \*must pass the entrance physical ability test, written exam (70% or better) and interview to be accepted for the department fire academy; \*must obtain State of Oregon EMT license within one year after probation and maintain for the duration of employment; \*recruits are required to complete the fire academy and become certified as an NFPA Fire Fighter I. (Time commitment- approximately six months, every Friday evening and Saturday); \*in addition to high school diploma, post high school education or an equivalent combination of education and experience is preferred and will be considered.
