*HAPPY HOLIDAYS from the GFD. We hope this month's newsletter finds you safe, warm & healthy. For the last month GFD has been collecting and receiving food and toys from the community to distribute back into the area to families needing assistance. Your generous support makes all the difference to families and children that may not receive new toys otherwise. You may continue to bring your toy & food donations to the fire department during business hours, M-F, 8am-5pm until December 23rd.

*Still stuck buying the perfect gift for someone? How about the gift of a new smoke alarm or carbon monoxide detector. Remember the effective life of alarms is about 10 years. Maybe provide a new flashlight for a winter power outage or a fire extinguisher for the home or car.

*For those who must drive in the weather this winter brings, consider a new can of deicer for your car. Driving with frozen windows can cause accidents. Don't forget to keep an emergency travel kit in the car with a blanket, water, high energy food and emergency light and/or road flares.

*Chimney Safety Reminder: Always dispose of fireplace ashes in a metal bucket and place outside away from any combustibles. Never use a paper bag for your ashes and do not place the ashes inside your garage until final disposal. Have your chimney cleaned or checked regularly. Prevention is much cheaper than a fire from a dirty or clogged chimney. Please recycle Christmas wrap—there are an increasing number of chimney fires due to placing wrapping paper in the fireplace or wood stove. Stay Safe!

Business License Renewals due Jan. 31st

Business license renewals are due January 31st. All businesses pay a fee of \$100, plus \$5 per employee and if the business is operating out of a home residence, an additional \$50 fee is required. For rental properties, the \$100 fee applies plus an additional \$25 per rental property. Business license applications may be downloaded from the city's website at www.ci.gladstone.or.us.

Lunch Buddy Program



The Lunch Buddy program at John Wetten Elementary is seeking volunteers. Lunch Buddy volunteers provide friendship, support and positive role modeling by having lunch and spending special time together at recess. Nationally, studies of students who

meet regularly with a mentor show that: 64% develop more positive attitudes toward school, 59% achieve higher grades, 46% are less likely to start using illegal drugs, 27% are less likely to start drinking, 33% are less likely to engage in violence. There are many students waiting for a lunch buddy mentor, but not enough volunteers to meet the need. You can choose to meet once weekly or twice monthly. Public Works Sanding



Sanding roadways during winter months is done by spreading small sized crushed rock on streets to improve vehicle traction. Sanding improves vehicle traction when

done after snowfall. During inclement snow and ice conditions, the city's Public Works Dept. will sand Oatfield & Webster roads and sometimes just the STOP intersections along Portland Ave. Depending on road conditions, Los Verdes Dr & Springhill Dr may also be sanded for use by residents in the Sherwood Forest, Los Verdes, Forest Park, Springhill & Charolais Heights neighborhoods. In addition, Caldwell Rd & Park Way to Oatfield Rd are often closed to through traffic during ice & snow conditions. Other streets may be sanded or closed to through traffic depending on weather and driving conditions. Please note that sanding of city streets is generally not effective unless done after snowfall ends. City residents are also requested to keep sidewalks clear of ice and snow. Thank youl
