New Library Facility Fact Sheet

PROPERTY SEARCH: The City will be conducting a search for available property in the Portland Avenue area. Universal Field Services has been contracted by the City and will conduct a mail survey for property owners to determine who might be interested in selling their property.

PROJECT BACKGROUND:

- On November 4, 2014, the citizens of Gladstone voted and approved funding for the construction of a new \$6.04 million, 13,000-16,000 sq. ft. library that would serve both the Oak Lodge and Gladstone communities.
- The approved ballot measure mandates library construction in the Portland Ave area between Gladstone High School and the Clackamas River.
- Clackamas County currently funds and operates the Oak Lodge Library. The County would like to turn over the daily operations of the library to a City and is offering Gladstone a one-time capital contribution of \$1 million and a one-time library district fund contribution of up to \$1.375 million to construct a new library and take over library services for the Oak Lodge community.
- The merger of the two libraries will increase the annual funds the City receives from the library district. For FY 2014/15 the library is estimated to receive \$631,763 from the library district. The merger would increase this funding to approximately \$1.2 million.
- Once constructed the library should operate solely on library district funds & grants.
- No new taxes, and no city or urban renewal funds should be used to construct or operate the new library.
- The City has also established a citizen advisory committee to consider the future of the Police Station and City Hall. No decisions have been made. Any additional proposed construction project would need voter approval before proceeding. If a proposal is made regarding a police station and City Hall additional property may be needed in the Portland Avenue area.

Gladstone Fire Dept. (GFD) News

- Don't Become an Oregon Statistic: The Oregon Fire Marshal's office reports "Fifty Oregonians lost their lives due to fire-related injuries in 2014". Of all fire fatalities, males were more than twice as likely to be a victim as females (35 males vs. 15 females). Adults 50 & older accounted for more than half (28) of total fatalities. Six of the fatalities were under the age of 18. Don't be a statistic in 2015! Residents are encouraged to: *Have working smoke alarms on every level of your home, outside each sleeping area and in each bedroom. *If you smoke, smoke outside. Always discard cigarette butts & ashes in a safe container. *When cooking, stay in the kitchen when using the stove top. *Keep things that can catch fire 3' away from sources of heat. *Consider using battery candles rather than open flame. In addition to fatalities, there were 214 civilian injuries, 124 firefighter injuries & more than \$128 million in property damage.
- Do You Have a Home Phone or Only a Cell Phone? When you call 9-1-1 on a cell phone, you may get a recording advising you have reached 9-1-1, do not hang up. For "help" say help after the tone. 9-1-1 centers receive thousands of accidental 9-1-1 cell phone dials every year, which has necessitated the recording system. Medical Teams International Mobile Dental Van

The Gladstone Senior Center, 1050 Portland Ave, will host a Medical Teams mobile dental clinic on April 16th from 9am to 2pm. Space is limited to 10-12 uninsured patients. Aid is for those with urgent dental needs such as extractions and fillings. Income must be under 200% of the Federal Poverty Level. Gross monthly income: One person = \$1,945/mo; Two people = \$2,622/mo. Call the Senior Center at 503-655-7701 for additional details or to schedule an appointment.

Water Project Construction Update

The tunnel boring machine will begin boring a tunnel under River Rd and McLoughlin Blvd, from Jenson Rd to Exeter St. Large storage tanks are set up at the tunneling site. To accommodate equipment, there is a single lane closure on River Rd at Jenson Rd—two lanes of traffic will be maintained. Access to park and boat ramp remains open. Over the next month, the ball field parking lot and portions of Meldrum Bar Park Rd where the water pipe was installed will be repaved. The new river intake pump station located on the Clackamas River will begin pumping water to the existing treatment plant in West Linn. HOMESERVE USA

The City of Gladstone has received numerous inquiries regarding a mailing local residents have received from HomeServe USA. The mailing informs recipients that they are responsible for the maintenance and repairs of their exterior water lines, leaving them liable for repairs which could potentially cost thousands of dollars. The Better Business Bureau (BBB) advises residents to read the notice very carefully, particularly the portion that says "HomeServe is an independent company separate from your local utility or community. The BBB notes that while the company is correct when they say homeowners are responsible for the maintenance and repair of their water linesfrom the street to the meter-the warranty coverage they offer is optional, not mandatory. The BBB recommends the following tips: *Never agree to any contract over the phone without first receiving it in writing; *Read the service contract very carefully; *Review your homeowners insurance policy or call your insurance agent to see if coverage is already provided; *Check the BBB website at www.bbb.org for issues.
