New Civic Buildings Ballot Measure Election Results

On November 3, 2015, Gladstone voters approved a ballot measure by a vote of 1204 (57.25%) to 899 (42.75%) to construct and incur debt to finance new civic buildings (City Hall and Police Station) each project to cost over \$1,000,000. No new taxes are associated with this authorization.

Leaf Pick Up Reminders

The Public Works Dept. would like to remind residents that public works will not pick up leaf piles that contain limbs or other debris. Residents are asked to put their leaves in the street no earlier than one day prior to scheduled pick up and allow six inches of drainage space between leaves and the curb to avoid stormwater flooding. Also, to avoid flooding, please help clean catch basin grates whenever they become covered with leaves. Please place small piles of leaves in your yard debris container. Please note the pick up dates are tentative based on the public works department work load.

*Greetings and HAPPY HOLIDAYS from Gladstone Fire Department. As Thanksgiving approaches, be sure to prepare for the colder weather as you gather with family and friends. Prepare your plan for power outages. Plan the safe use of candles (if necessary) and use battery operated flashlights when possible. DO NOT use barbecue or propane cooking devices (inside your home) during power outages for temporary heating or cooking. Also, be prepared for winter in your car. Pack a blanket, flashlight and emergency food. Carry traction devices and consider jumper cables. Remember, people sometimes get stuck in winter conditions in areas without cell phone reception.
*Your firefighters are anticipating a new record of responding to about 1600 calls for

assistance in 2015. All our firefighters live or work within Gladstone and feel it is an honor to serve our neighbors. If you are interested in serving as a firefighter, please contact Jeff Smith at 503-557-2774 for information on how to apply.

Charter Review Advisory Committee




