Water Leaks

It is possible to detect leaks in your home on your own. Most water leaks can be seen or heard, though some can be difficult to detect. Here are steps to check if you may have a leak: 1) Turn off all water sources being used in the house or any water features in your yard. Locate the water meter on your property (usually located between street and sidewalk). 2) Remove the meter box lid and read/write down all the numbers located on the meter. 3) Wait 30 minutes to an hour, then re-read your meter. If you have all the water off in the house/vard and the meter numbers have changed, a leak is present somewhere on the property side of the meter. If you have a bad leak it can be seen pretty fast. If it is smaller leak, like a small leak in the toilet, it may take more time to see it in the meter. Finding the Leak: Isolate the line that runs from the house to the street. Follow these steps: Turn off the water at the house (not at the meter), if numbers continue to increase, there is a leak in the service line from the house to the meter. If the numbers do not continue to increase, there is a leak in the house. Check your house for leaking toilets (toilet flapper not tightly fitted), faucets dripping, look under sinks/fixtures, crawl spaces, outside faucets or hose connections. Some people fix their own leak, while others hire a professional, such as leak detection companies or plumbers. For emergency water turn off, M-F, 8:00 am to 4:30 pm, a \$25 fee will be added to account, or after 4:30 pm a \$175 fee will be added to account.

Valley View Drive Dog Park

At it's meeting on April 8, 2014, Gladstone City Council decided to put on hold the application to rezone the lot adjacent to Nick Shannon Park and amend the comprehensive plan. The rezoning application requested a change from residential to open space. The open space zoning would allow a dog park to be placed on the property. The Park and Recreation Board will be asked to consider alternate locations for a dog park.



Gladstone Police Dept. Approved for State Accreditation Following a two day on-site inspection by the Oregon Accreditation Alliance, your police department has been approved for state accreditation. This means the Gladstone Police Dept. (GPD) has met the 102 standards of best practices for police departments in the state of Oregon. GPD is the 35th police depart-ment in Oregon to become accredited, out of a total of 162 police departments statewide. This distinction is revisited every three years to become reaccredited--showing GPD is maintaining it's high standard of professionalism.
