Master Fee Increases

At its meeting on January 14, 2014, City Council approved master fee increases. Some fee increases include: Administration: Business License (see article below); Notary fee: \$5/ resident, \$10/non-resident; Public Records Research: based on hourly rate; Copy: 25¢; Returned check charge: \$35; Fire: Fire Log Report: \$15. Library: Late charge (per day) 25¢ (max \$3 child/\$5 adult); Lost items: replacement cost. Police: A-Frame sign permit: \$100; Animal permit application (per year) \$25; Block Party: \$35; Police Report (first 5 pages): \$10, each additional \$1/page; Radar Certification (per record): \$5; Temporary Storage Container: \$50; Vehicle impound (after business hours): \$125, (during business hours) \$100. Public Works: Barricade Deliver & Pick Up: \$50; Contractor Hydrant Hook-Up Application (plus water meter costs): \$50; Dye Test (resident or commercial): \$100; Erosion Control Violation: \$300; Fire hydrant water permit (per hook up + cost of actual water): \$50; Street Opening Inspection fee: \$85; Street Opening Permit Fee: \$150; Street Opening Re-Inspection fee: \$85. <u>Senior Center</u>: Building Rental (per hour non-profit): \$40; Building Rental (per hour private party): \$50; Building Rental (per hour profit making): \$70; Kitchen Fee: \$50; Meal (suggested donation under 60): \$5, (over 60): \$2.50; Newsletter subscription per year: \$8; Van donation (suggested donation each way): \$1; Friday excursions: \$7-25 (varies). Gladstone Fire Department (GFD) News

*Happy New Year—a season for reflecting on the past and for new resolutions. 2014 is a great time to start over or to start something new. Why not make a commitment to fire safety in 2014? The firefighters at the GFD are committed to respond and serve in the event of an emergency. GFD responded to 1571 calls in 2013. Please assist us with prevention

efforts to keep your home safe by performing the following simple steps: 1) Always dispose of fireplace ashes in a metal bucket and place outside away from any combustibles. Never use a paper bag and do not place ashes in your garbage. 2) Candles can be beautiful but are one of the leading causes of residential fires recorded in 2013. Never leave candles unattended. Remember the new flameless candles are a safe option—they pro-duce a nice flickering light, with no open flame. 3) Smoke alarms—why mention smoke alarms again—because some people did not take time to inspect or replace alarms since the last reminder. Private Sewer Lines

Did you know that flushing items such as cleaning & baby wipes can cause damage to your private sewer line as well as Gladstone's public sewer system? Many things routinely flushed down the toilet or washed down the drain, including items sold as "flushable" can cause expensive maintenance problems and sewer back-ups in your home, the public sewer system and in the environment. Residents are reminded that Chapter 13.12.070 (3) of the Gladstone Municipal Code states: "The customer shall be responsible for the maintenance of the private sewer line from the public sewer connection to the premises served. The city shall not be liable for any damage accruing from the failure of a pri-vate sewer or of fixture of appurtenances attached thereto."
