



Utility (Water/Sewer) Billing Auto Pay

Residents now have the ability to request their bi-monthly utility (water/sewer) bill to be automatically deducted from their checking or savings account. The authorization agreement for Auto Pay (ACH Debits) may be found on the City's website, www.ci.gladstone.or.us or by stopping by City Hall, Monday-Friday, 8am-5pm. Funds will be withdrawn on the DUE DATE only for the AMOUNT DUE listed on the billing statement. No alternative payment dates will be available. Residents must submit their completed form by August 5th to be effective for the July/August billing cycle.

*New GPD Officer to Start Academy Training—Lee Gilliam, Gladstone's newest police officer, was sworn in at the June 10th City Council meeting by Judge Linda Beloof. He will begin his training at the Police Academy later this month. Please join us in welcoming him. *Thank You to Gladstone Residents-Many tasks had to be accomplished by law enforcement in a short period of time during the police & SWAT incident that took place on July 7th, with ensuring the safety of community members being the first priority. Some of the work included securing the scene to ensure the person with the gun could not leave, alerting and safeguarding surrounding neighbors, clearing children off the grass field at the neighboring school, locking down a local daycare, processing children at the school for release to parents, sending out a reverse 9-1-1 warning, traffic control and logistical support for 50+ officers. Please know that the patience and support of the community during such a difficult and complex event is much appreciated, as is the support provided by the many area law enforcement agencies that assisted.

New Library Ballot Measure

Gladstone City Council has approved a Notice of District Measure Election to be placed on the November 4, 2014 General Election. Voters will be asked for authorization to construct and incur debt to finance a new library projected to cost over \$1,000,000. This ballot measure would be fully funded by Library District revenue. There will be no tax increase for Gladstone voters and no City or Urban Renewal funds can be used to construct or operate the new facility. City Council Elections

The City Council is an elected policy decision making body for the City of Gladstone. The Council serves with an equal number of "lay members" on the Budget Committee and hears land use appeals of decisions made by the Planning Commission. Council members also serve as liaisons on advisory boards and commissions. Four year terms of Mayor and City Council positions #1, #3, & #5, held by Wade Byers, vacant, Kari Martinez and Hal Busch respectively, will expire December 31, 2014. If you are interested in being a candidate, you must be a registered voter and have resided in the city for twelve months immediately preceding the election on November 4, 2014. Information and instructions are on the City website. A nomination petition or declaration of candidacy will be filed not sooner than 120 days nor later than 70 days before the date of the election. City Council Vacancy

At its meeting on May 27th, the City Council regretfully accepted the resignation of Ray Jaren who held City Council Position #1. Position #1's term expires 12-31-2014 and is open for applicants to run in the November General Election. In the interim, the Council is requesting interested applicants to apply for an appointment to the short-term vacancy. The City Council will consider applications for the short-term appointment (August-December 2014) at the August 12th meeting. 

For example, unsanitary and unsafe conditions such as accumulations of debris, storage of junk, or obstructing clear vision at intersections are prohibited by the nuisance code. A public nuisance may also be caused by any fence, dam or other obstruction in a natural water course that could back up water and significantly affect other property or public street.
