#### McLoughlin Lane Closures

One lane of northbound Oregon Highway 99E (McLoughlin Blvd), will be closed from 9am to 3pm weekdays between Naef Rd & Clackamas River Bridge. Southbound lanes will be closed from 7am to 3pm. The project is scheduled for completion in the fall of 2014. The project will: rebuild sections of 99E where the roadway is failing under the asphalt, repave 99E from Naef Rd to the Clackamas River Bridge, fill in sidewalk gaps at multiple locations, connect the traffic signals to improve traffic flow, stripe bike lanes & improve sub-standard ADA ramps in multiple locations. During construction, multiple lane closures will occur at night. Business access will remain open during the day, but expect delays during paving. #### Fire Lanes & Fire Hydrants

Fire Lanes-Please NEVER park in a fire lanenot even for a minute. Marked fire lanes need to remain clear and unobstructed during all hours, every day!

Fire Hydrants-need to remain accessible at all times. As you get outdoors this spring & summer, please be sure the fire hydrant on your property is clean and clear of all grass, weeds and other landscaping. A three (3) foot clear area in all directions around the fire hydrant is required by code. Seasonal workers will be cleaning around and flowing water from fire hydrants this spring & summer. Water flows are needed to keep a good water system and properly working fire hydrants in the event of an emergency. When workers are flowing a fire hydrant near your home you may notice a slight discoloration in the water—that will clear within a day. For questions call Mike Funk, Fire Marshal, at 503-557-2775.
