# LO/Tigard Water Partnership Project Update

The horizontal directional drilled (HDD) portion of the pipeline under the Willamette River is staged at Meldrum Bar Park. In mid-October, 240 foot lengths of pipeline arrived on a barge which is parked near the staging area at Meldrum. The lengths of pipe are now being welded together into a continuous, 3,800 foot length, which will then be pulled through the tunnel that was

drilled over the past few months. The pullback will occur the last week of October, will operate 24 hours per day and take 1-3 days to complete. Neighbors can expect to see several cranes that will be used to hoist the pipe as it is pulled into the tunnel.

# Gladstone Police Department (GPD) Updates

\*Officer Gilliam to Graduate-On Nov. 7th, Officer Gilliam will graduate from the basic police academy. His academy sergeant tells us Officer Gilliam will be an excellent addition to GPD. After graduation he will transition to his field training on the streets of Gladstone. Officer Gilliam is excited to begin this next phase of his training and looks forward to helping Gladstone be a safer city, in partnership with the community!

\*Speed Enforcement—Gladstone is mostly a residential community with many cross streets. The GPD appreciates motorists who respect the speed limits. Occasionally, we hear from community members about motorists driving too fast in neighborhoods. When this happens we use a combination of education and enforcement to help. We use our GPD speed trailer in problem areas to make drivers aware of how fast they are moving, and thank volunteer Len Nelson for managing this program. Officers also conduct speed enforcement in problem areas to slow motorists down and educate them on the dangers of driving too fast. Our goals are to save lives, reduce injuries and severity of collisions.

\*Emergency Preparedness—Based on historical data, experts say we are likely overdue for a major earthquake. This is why GPD strongly encourages community members to be prepared for this type of emergency or other natural disaster. GPD learned from others who have lived through major disasters that residents might need to be self-sufficient for several days until relief comes. \*Preventing Crime—The best way to prevent crime is to harden the target. This means you reduce the opportunity for a crime to occur. # Test Your Smoke Alarm

October is fire safety month so Gladstone firefighters would like to remind residents to test their smoke alarm. Proper working smoke alarms have saved thousands of lives! The opposite results can be noted for homes without a working smoke alarm. Each year countless lives are needlessly lost in homes without a working smoke alarm. Remember smoke alarms do not last forever—typically a 10 year battery life— but you must still manually test your unit monthly. Pick the same day each month to test your detector-write it on your calendar through the year's end. Take this time to have your school age child assist with testing-discuss what they are to do when the alarm goes off. Teach them to crawl low under the smoke, get outside, stay outside, call 9-1-1 from outside and go to a predetermined family meeting spot. 
