The Public Works Dept. would like to remind residents that public works will not pick up leaf piles that contain limbs or other debris. Residents are asked to put their leaves in the street no earlier than one day



leaves in the street no earlier than one day prior to scheduled pick up and allow six inches of drainage space between leaves and the curb to avoid stormwater flooding. Also, to avoid flooding, please help clean catch basin grates whenever they become covered with leaves. ### Remembering Herb Beals

Gladstone recently lost long-time local historian, Herb Beals. Herb passed away on November 2nd and will long be remembered for the unselfish contributions he made to our community through his volunteer work and his preservation of the City's history. Herb previously served on the City's Planning Commission, was a member



of the Gladstone Historical Society, Chautauqua Festival Committee and author of Gladstone, Oregon, A History, Part I, II & III. Herb spent the last several decades of his life as Gladstone's tireless advocate and resident professional historian. At the Chautauqua Festival, Herb's favorite event of the year, he would participate in the parade and set up a booth for the Gladstone Historical Society. During the festival, Herb gave tours of the local historical homes, gladly sharing all the facts he knew about the city from writing his threevolume history of Gladstone. Herb and family moved to Gladstone in 1962, where his love of writing, genealogy and community drew him to Gladstone history. He considered Gladstone to be his extended family. He was a passionate volunteer at schools, historical societies, coffee shops and churches where he enjoyed sharing his knowledge. Herb will truly be missed! (Excerpts from Clackamas Review)

The Gladstone Fire Department is currently recruiting for on-call firefighters. Job qualifications required: \*high school diploma or equivalent, \*must be a minimum of 18 years of age, \*must pass a criminal background

check and drug test, \*must possess a current, valid Oregon driver's license and maintain a driving record insurable by the City's insurer as a minimum qualification to maintain the position of firefighter, \*must pass the entrance physical ability test, written exam (70% or better) and interview to be accepted for the department fire academy, \*must obtain State of Oregon EMT license within one year after probation and maintain it during duration of employment, \*must reside or work within boundaries of Gladstone Fire Dept. during employment, \*recruits are required to complete the fire academy and become certified as a NFPA Fire Fighter I. (time commitment—approximately six months, every Friday evening and Saturday), \*in addition to a high school diploma, posthigh school education or an equivalent combination of education and experience is preferred and will be considered. Applications are available at the Gladstone Fire Station, 555 Portland Ave, Monday-Friday, 8am to 5pm. The application deadline for this process closes January 31, 2014. ## Gladstone Fire Dept. Collects and Delivers


The holidays are coming and the numbers of local people who need holiday assistance is larger than ever! For the last several years the Gladstone Fire Department has worked closely with Clackamas County's "Compassion in Action" and the Oregon City Elks Club to help meet the needs here in Gladstone. Gladstone Fire is an agency that collects food and new toys for families in need. Members of the fire department delivered food and toy baskets to more than 120 Gladstone families that qualified for assistance in 2012. The Gladstone Fire Department IS NOT ABLE TO ACCEPT FOOD & TOY REQUESTS. To request a food basket or toys, persons must contact their assigned social worker, food stamp or mental health provider or Clackamas County's Compassion in Action at 503-632-0562 or visit www.ciacc.org. After Thanksgiving, residents may drop off their canned food or new unwrapped toy donations to donation barrels located at many Gladstone businesses, Fire Hall or Library.


