### Chief Max Patterson Re-Dedication Ceremony



In May of 1991, The Clackamette Optimist The City Council is Club dedicated a United States Flag to Chief an elected policy Max Patterson for his service and dedication to decision-making the Gladstone community.

Chief Patterson lived in the Gladstone area for more than 40 years, attending grade school in Gladstone, graduate of West Linn High School and attended Portland State University.

Words used to describe Chief Patterson were "dignity" and "integrity". He was also described as a true friend of the Gladstone Community.

Chief Patterson served as a Gladstone Reserve Officer from 1962-1970 and rose to the rank of Chief of Police in 1981 through 1990.

Chief Patterson is a graduate of the FBI National Academy, session 108 in 1977.

Oregon Association of Chiefs of Police named an award after Chief Patterson, "The Max Patterson Award" for outstanding contributions to OACP for the community presenting programs of outstanding benefit to young people of all ages in their community. The award is still given today!

In honor of Chief Max Patterson, the City of Gladstone has re-dedicated this plaque (pictured to the right) from old city hall to the Gladstone Civic Center.



### Utility Rate Increases

Effective July 1, 2022, the pass-through rates for Oak Lodge Sanitary District (OLSD), Water Environmental Services (WES) and North Clackamas Water Commission (NCCWC) are set to change. Please see below for what you can expect to see on your July bill, that you will receive the beginning of August.

OLSD pass-through rate will increase \$3.72, from \$54.64 to \$58.36.

WES pass-through rate will increase by \$1.30, from \$26.60 to \$27.90.

NCCWC pass-through rate will increase by \$0.0262 from \$0.7667 to \$0.7929.

### Meldrum Bar Parking Pass for Gladstone Residents

Gladstone residents can apply for a free Meldrum Bar Parking Pass by visiting the Gladstone Civic Center at 18505 Portland Ave. A piece of mail with the resident's name and Gladstone address along with a valid ID are required. You will be asked to complete a short application and can be presented with up to two parking passes at that time.

#### Is your current pass about to expire?

For residents who pay the City of Gladstone directly for water, sewer, stormwater- renewal passes will be mailed to the address on file by the first of the month that your pass expires.

For residents who do not pay the City of Gladstone directly-information on how to renew the pass will be mailed by the 15th of the month prior to the expiration date.

### Are other passes acceptable within Meldrum Bar Park?

Yes, Special Access Passes for Veterans with Disabilities from Oregon State Parks or Disabled Parking Permits from DMV can be used in place of a Meldrum Bar Parking Pass.

### A Minute of Gladstone History - by Kim Argraves Huey,



It's Summer! Let's go fishing...and maybe solve a mystery?

In 1899, a 25-year-old Rudyard Kipling (pictured on the left) went fishing in the Clackamas River and immortalized his adventure in the book "From Sea to Sea – Letters of Travel". In 2012, Debra Wynn, a cataloger at the Library of Congress, recommended to the Oregon Geographic Names Board, that an 18-foothigh rock located in the Clackamas River, a little east

of Carver, be named Kipling's Rock in honor of Kipling's momentous fishing adventure. Afterall, that rock is in the vicinity and it's really old. Therefore, it could have witnessed Kipling pulling salmon out the river. Old-timers even suggested that Kipling "might have" fished from that rock...a fish tale since there are no corroborating facts. In February 2014, the rock received its new name.

So, where did old-timers of a hundred years ago think Kipling fished? From local newspapers: April 1900: "R. Kipling angled at the Clackamas Fishery." November 1901: "The Clackamas Fishery is 7 miles from the junction of the Clackamas and Willamette River." December 1910: "R. Kipling caught his famous salmon a few miles above the junction of the two rivers." October 1913: "R. Kipling took his salmon where a great power dam is to be constructed by a Portland Company (never built) near the Clear Creek Creamery (Carver). "February 1914: "The people of Gladstone aver that R. Kipling fished two miles north of Oregon City (or east edge of Gladstone)." April 1915: "R. Kipling fished at Oregon City." Obviously, as time goes on, details get less precise for old-timers of any era.

However, Kipling did provide some information about his great fishing adventure in his book. The following is a paraphrase: June 23: Starting in Portland, the fishing was fifteen miles away to "a place called Clackamas". People told him the roads were not good and overwhelmed him with directions to sawmills, ferries, and signposts. Leaving Portland, he travelled first on a plank road and then six miles on a macadamized road. A railroad (interurban trolley) ran between him and the banks of the Willamette. On arriving at Clackamas, he found a stream that flowed amid fields of crops surrounded by hills of pines and a hundred-foot bluff. The river broke over a weir (an old dam or a fish fence) about a quarter mile away. The fishing area was seventy yards broad and divided by a pebbly island.

So, where do "you" think Kipling fished? Perhaps the mystery can never be solved, but one thing is for certain. It is extremely unlikely that Kipling fished at Gladstone. However, considering the route he described to the Clackamas River, it is very possible he passed through the edge of Gladstone. 
### City of Gladstone Street Sweeping Schedule

#### Real ID

Starting May 3, 2023, Oregonians will need to show a different form of ID to get through airport security. That is when the TSA will stop accepting standard Oregon driver license or ID card. That new ID requirement also applies at other federal facilities such as military bases. If you usually travel with your Oregon license, permit or ID card you need to be prepared to act before your next flight. Here are the three key things you need to know to be Real ID ready:

- 1. You will need to visit a DMV to be issued a Real ID compliant license, permit or ID card. The most convenient time to make the switch is when you are renewing your card, but you may need to replace it earlier if you know you plan to travel.

### Heat Related Illness

With this years warm weather, it is important to recognize signs of heat-related illnesses:

Heat Exhaustion: Heavy sweating; cold, pale clammy skin; fast, weak pulse; nausea/vomiting; muscle cramps; tiredness/weakness; dizziness; headache; or fainting. What to do: Move to cool place; loosen clothes; put cool, wet cloths on body; sip water. Get medical help right away if: You are throwing up, symptoms get worse, or your symptoms last longer than 1 hour.

Heat Stroke: High body temperature (103 degrees F or higher); hot, red, dry, or damp skin; fast, strong pulse; headache; dizziness; nausea; confusion; losing consciousness. What to do: Call 911, Heat stroke is a medical emergency! Move the person to a cooler place; help lower body temperature with cool cloths or a cool bath; do not give the person anything to drink.

If you must be out on these hot days, pace yourself, take lots of breaks, and drink plenty of water.

- •Parental supervision of children is required no lifeguard on duty;
- •Swim diapers are required for all persons who are not toilet trained:
- •Dogs/animals are not allowed in the feature (dog hair clogs the water system and there is potential of introducing fecal matter into the water system);
- •Do not use the spray park if you have had diarrhea in the last two weeks.
