The police department remained busy during the month of April as you will see throughout this monthly report. From an administrative perspective, the focus of activity surrounded the preparation of the 2021-2023 biennial budget which was completed pending approval of the Gladstone Budget Committee and the overall approval of the Gladstone City Council. The police department worked very diligently in how we recommend spending public money while ensuring the police department meets its overall goals of providing a high quality of life through our public safety strategies.

Additionally, over the last couple of months, the police department has been dealing with a couple different properties as it relates to code enforcement. Specifically, I want to update everyone on the status of Arlington and Portland Ave. We received multiple complaints regarding pallets blocking the sidewalk and hazardous parking along the street. The police department has taken an active approach in hopes of correcting the issues and started with working with the violator to gain compliance. After a period of time we recognized those attempts were not successful then took the approach of formal enforcement of our city codes. The police department continues to enforce violations and understand there is a lot of frustration in the community over this property. Know that your police department is working hard to correct those violations and will continue to do so until the issue is resolved.

Finally, the traffic safety committee met for the first time this year and will hold its second meeting in June. The first meeting covered goals set for the year and introducing new members to the committee. I look forward to the years' work that this committee will bring and how well it will enhance our community.

CASE UPDATES

19640 MCLOUGHLIN BLVD – Open case that is ongoing related to Junk Keeping, Scattering Rubbish and Solid Waste Storage. Vehicles have been removed from the property. Property owner has been located and citations have been issued. Initial court appearance scheduled for 05/11/21.



150 W CLACKAMAS BLVD – This is the pallet refurbishing business on Arlington St. Violations are ongoing and the property has been determined to be a Chronic Nuisance Property. Notice has been given to the property owner and they are required to propose an acceptable abatement plan no later than 05/14/21. The pallet business owner has been issued citations and the first court appearance is scheduled for 05/11/21.

This month GPD Patrol Officers responded to several Code Enforcement related incidents:

- 20 Parking Complaints
- 8 Abandoned Vehicles

- 40 Premise Checks

The patrol officers are assisting Code Enforcement by addressing issues as they come into contact with them.

This month our parking complaints stayed about the same as last month and our abandoned vehicle calls dropped slightly. There were more vehicles addressed throughout the city by our code enforcement officer (See Boyle's Report for more detail).

Animal complaints held steady with one bite reported this month. The owner was cited for the behavior of the dog.

Noise complaints went up dramatically this month. There weather has been warmer and more people are engaging in springtime activities like camp fires and BBQ's. Many citizens are at home due to COVID as well.

Officers have added premise checks to their proactive events and this relates to code enforcement as they are checking vacant houses, parks, businesses and other areas that need increased presence.

Highlights/Noteworthy:

1. On April 7, 2021, Defendant pled guilty to Criminal Mistreatment and Attempted Sexual Abuse in the First Degree. She was sentenced to 24 months in prison and 5 years of post-prison supervision. (GPD Case 18-012724)
2. On April 29, 2021, Defendant was convicted for a second time in Clackamas County Circuit Court for two counts of Unlawful Sexual Penetration in the First Degree, one count of Sodomy in the First Degree, seven counts of Using a Child in Display of Sexually Explicit Conduct, and four counts of Sexual Abuse in the First Degree. The defendant's first conviction was overturned by the Oregon Court of Appeals. The cases primary investigator, Detective Voss (Retired), myself, Milwaukie PD Detective Giddings (Retired), and members of the Clackamas County Child Abuse Multi-Disciplinary Team were among those who testified in trial. K9 Nanuk is a four-and-a-half-year-old German Shepherd born in Slovakia. At seven weeks old K9 Nanuk was sold to a man in Germany who started training K9 Nanuk. In Germany in order to breed a dog they must achieve a sport title. In Germany the primary sport is schutzhund. schutzhund training is comprised of three separate parts, they are obedience, tracking, and protection work. You can accomplish three levels of titles from this training. K9 Nanuk was imprinted with the beginning knowledge in schutzhund training however he was sold at a young age and he had not achieved a title. Most working dogs are sold to kennels where police agencies purchase them with some sport dog training up to titled dogs in sport training. The training is then adapted to police work.

April 2- Friday

A citizen called in to report they saw the suspect that GPD had posted on Facebook related to a theft. Officers located the suspect and learned he had already been cited for the theft but learned he had a new warrant for his arrest. The subject was cited for the warrant and released.

An officer checked on a subject who was sitting under some bushes wrapped in a blanket. The officer learned the subject was reported missing out of Gresham and had a felony warrant out of Columbia County. The officer connected the subject with family over the phone before the transport to jail.

April 7- Wednesday

There was a traffic crash at the intersection of 82nd Dr and Oatfield Rd. One of the vehicles involved had been called in as a DUII driver at the Clackamas Fred Meyer. A witness to the crash had videoed the suspect's poor driving and the crash. The suspect had fallen out of the car after the crash and was belligerently drunk. The subject had to be restrained in the ambulance and at the hospital. A search warrant was written for the driver's blood as they were not coherent enough to ask for consent. The driver was cited the next day for DUII and Reckless Driving.

April 15- Thursday

Stanley's Corner had a male subject who urinated all over the female bathroom. The bartender tried to escort the subject out but the subject swung at the bartender and a fight ensued. The suspect fled before police arrived but they were able to identify the suspect because he left his phone behind. The suspect was later cited for assaulting the bartender.

April 17- Saturday

On a very hot day officers were doing extra patrols in and around the parks. In the parking lot next to High Rocks Park an officer located a subject acting strange. They seemed lethargic and the officer recognized the symptoms as heat exhaustion. Medical was called right away and they were transported to the hospital.

Officers went with GFD on a burn complaint at Billy Goat Island. Two bonfires were located. The fires were put out and the people involved were excluded from the area.

April 18- Sunday

A vehicle was stopped for a traffic violation. It was occupied by 4 subjects. None of them had identification and all lied about what was going on. There were two juveniles in the back seat with a case of beer. After everyone was detained. It was learned the beer was stolen from a Safeway Store. The two juveniles were transported to the Intake and Assessment Center for MIP and curfew violations. Lake Oswego PD responded to the scene to assist in identifying the driver and other passenger with a mobile printing machine. The remaining passenger was identified as a juvenile with a felony warrant and was transported to the detention center in Portland. The driver was identified and cited for crimes. The vehicle was towed.

April 21- Wednesday

While two officers were patrolling Cross Park after hours they came across a group of people near some cars parked at the foot bridge. The officers witnessed two of the people punch each other and ran over to stop the fight. One subject was detained and the other eventually ran on foot. After a short foot pursuit, the subject was caught and resisted arrest. Eventually the subject was safely handcuffed and placed in a patrol car. The scene was chaotic as several subject circled the officers trying to arrest the subject who ran and began yelling at the officers. CCSO deputies and OCPD officers responded to assist with the small crowd that formed. Once the subject was in a patrol car the crowd calmed and dispersed. Both subjects involved in the fight were arrested.

April 22- Thursday

While patrolling Cross Park an officer located several bicycles beyond a fence. The officer followed a trail next to the bikes down a hill and located a group of juveniles who had been smoking marijuana. Two juveniles had marijuana on them still and one of them had a half bottle of vodka. Both were arrested and taken to the Intake and Assessment Center.

A truck crashed into two retaining walls on Los Verdes Dr before crashing into a courtyard fence in front of a house. No one in the house was injured and the structure did not suffer any damage. The driver failed field sobriety tests and was arrested. The driver was transported to Milwaukie PD for the breath test which was .18%.

April 23- Friday

Officers assisted on a traffic crash where a subject suffering a mental health crisis was ramming cars on the freeway just south of Gladstone. The subject rammed a deputy's patrol car as well. The subject was taken into custody and GPD helped interview a few witnesses.

Shortly after the previous call officers assisted OSP on a report of a vehicle ramming another car with gunshots being fired. GPD located half of the involved parties on 82nd Dr and held them until OSP could take over.

April 1- Thursday

With the very nice weather (70+ degrees), Gladstone parks have been very busy. Officers spent time patrolling the parks, and checking some of the areas where some of our local homeless tend to congregate. Some of the homeless folks that are known to Gladstone Police Department officers are frequently offered assistance and resource information, but most decline any offers of assistance.

April 3- Saturday

Officer Lau has been doing a great job focusing on traffic safety in Gladstone. He arrested another impaired driver during his shift. This was Officer Lau's 8th DUII arrest since joining the Gladstone Police Department in October of 2020.

Safeway has a new loss prevention officer working at their Gladstone location. Their expectation is to pursue criminal charges in all cases where loss prevention is the reporting party. If other store employees call, they will likely handle those cases on an individual/ case-by-case basis. This store is one that experiences the highest amount of theft (Safeway/ Albertson's brand).

April 7- Wednesday

Officers received a report of a catalytic converter theft from a vehicle that had been parked in the parking lot at the Holiday Inn on 82nd Dr. No suspect information was known. There have been many catalytic converter thefts reported in the region within the last month or so. We have received several reports here in Gladstone.

Officers conducted a Distracted Driving Traffic Enforcement detail for approximately two hours. Several traffic stops were made, resulting in several warnings and some citations being issued.

At approximately 16:30, officers responded to a traffic crash near the intersection of 82nd Dr./ Oatfield Rd. It was determined that one of the drivers was impaired. Officers teamed up to deal with the DUII investigation, the crash investigation, and the traffic control issues that this incident created at this time of day. The impaired driver was uncooperative, which resulted in the need for a search warrant to be drafted and subsequently granted to obtain a blood sample from the driver. Great job by all!

April 8- Thursday

An officer responded to a behavioral health incident at the Budget Inn Motel. There are currently several tenants of the motel that struggle with mental illness. Officers are frequently responding to the location to help these people de-escalate their crisis. Officers frequently team up with members of the Clackamas County Behavioral Health Unit, which has been a tremendous asset to our community; however, they are not always available.

April 9- Friday

Multiple traffic stops were made for traffic infractions throughout the city. Officers have been paying extra attention for distracted driving/ cell phone violations since April is Distracted Driving Awareness Month.

April 10- Saturday

While on patrol, an officer came upon a subject near a home where it was known the subject was prohibited from being around. The subject was arrested for violation of the valid restraining order. The adult male was posturing in an aggressive manner like he may want to fight. Officers were able to talk with the subject and obtain voluntary compliance and take him into custody without any additional issues.

April 11- Sunday

Officers handled several calls for service early in the day. At around 11:45, officers responded to a report of a traffic crash in the 1100 block of 82nd Dr. As officers arrived, they realized that there was a significant scene with serious injuries to both drivers. Emergency medical personnel rendered aid to the involved drivers, but it was later determined that one of the drivers had died as a result of their injuries. The cause and contributing factors remain under investigation. Clackamas County Sheriff's Office, Oregon City Police Department, Molalla Police Department, Lake Oswego Police Department, the Clackamas County Medical Examiner's Office, and the Clackamas County District Attorney's Office responded to assist the Gladstone Police Department with this very complex scene/ investigation. We are very grateful for the assistance from our neighboring agencies and community partners.

April 16- Thursday

At approximately 04:00, officers were patrolling Meldrum Bar Park/ Dahl Beach when they located two subjects who were in violation of park hours. The subjects were identified and one

of them was determined to have a valid felony arrest warrant. He was arrested and transported to the Clackamas County Jail, where he was booked and lodged.

April 17- Friday

A restraining order violation was reported in a mobile home park off of River Rd. The suspect intentionally and knowingly violated the order. The suspect was arrested and then transported to the Clackamas County Jail.

Officers have been stopping many vehicles for traffic infractions. McLoughlin Blvd., 82nd Dr., and Oatfield Rd. have been the location of many of these stops. There has been an increase in traffic crashes over the last several weeks. The emphasis on traffic safety is very important. Most of the crashes are related to driver error/ inattention.



April 18- Saturday

Shortly after midnight, officers stopped a car full of juveniles. The minors were in possession of prohibited substances, had warrants/ were missing, among many other issues. Three Gladstone Police Department officers, with the help of one Lake Oswego officer were able to work through the many challenges. Excellent team work!

April 22- Wednesday

At about 22:45, a crash was reported on Los Verdes Rd., where a vehicle was believed to have driven into a house. Officers responded where they contacted the driver who was determined to be impaired (DUI- alcohol). Multiple residential properties sustained damage during the incident. Fortunately, no injuries were reported.

April 29- Wednesday

Over the past week or so, there has been an influx of child abuse/ child neglect reports that have been cross-reported to the Gladstone Police Department by Oregon Department of Human Services- Child Welfare. Officers have been assigned the reports for follow-up investigation/ assessment. As children have returned to in-person learning, there have been additional reports of abuse; typically this occurs when abuse or neglect is disclosed or observed by a mandatory reporter such as a teach, counselor, or medical professional.

Officers responded to a residence on a CPR/ AED call, arriving before the fire department and immediately began attempts to resuscitate the resident. Upon arrival of fire department personnel, officers continued assisting, working as a team with our fire department/ emergency medical services folks. Unfortunately, the resident was unable to be revived. A Gladstone Police Department chaplain responded to assist. Great work by all.

Gladstone Police Department worked with the Friends of Gladstone Nature Park to ensure the Gladstone Nature Park was safe place for all residents and guests to enjoy as they conducted their plant sale. Gladstone Police Department officers conducted extra patrols, and walked through the park to chat with members of the community. A temporary crosswalk was established on Webster Rd, using traffic cones. Organizers of the event reported it being very successful. They thanked Gladstone Police Department for helping ensure everyone's safety during the event.

April 5, 2021 - Monday

Officer Butler and Officer Lau responded to a mental health incident where a known subject was being verbally aggressive and making irrational threats. The subject called 911 four times to make irrational complaints about her mother. Officer Butler and Officer Lau were able to locate the subject. She was pulled over and officers attempted to speak with her. Officer Lau, suspected she would drive away, so he pre-emptively placed spike strips under her tires. The subject drove off, over the spike strips and pulled over. She then locked herself inside the vehicle and began honking the horn. CCSO units arrived to assist and it was found that she had a can of pepper spray in her lap and has been known to carry knives and replica guns. She was taken into custody for Attempt Elude in a Vehicle, Interfering with a Peace Officer, Resisting Arrest and Disorderly Conduct II. She was then placed on a police hold for her mental health crisis.

Officer Hutchinson and Officer Graves responded to a slumped over individual in a vehicle on W Fairfield St. AMR had been called to check on someone with a medical condition but found a male sitting in the running vehicle with a strong odor of alcohol coming from his person. The male subject said he was going to work. The subject admitted to drinking vodka. He blew a .33 BAC when processed. He was cited and released to his father.

April 6, 2021 - Tuesday

Officer Herkamp and Officer Olson were dispatched to a missing 7-year-old special needs boy. Officers checked the house and surrounding area. The child was found trying to walk to a friend's house. He was returned home safely.

April 7, 2021 - Wednesday

Sergeant Okerman/Winters, Sergeant Leake and Officer Olson responded to a traffic crash on 82nd Drive and Oatfield. It was reported that a Dodge Van hit a Hyundai at the stop light. The driver of the van got out of the vehicle and fell to the ground. She appeared to be intoxicated. When officers arrived the female driver of the van was being loaded into an ambulance. April 11, 2021 – Sunday

Officer Hutchinson and Officer Herkamp responded to an injury crash on 82nd Drive where it was reported two vehicles had crashed and both were upside down with people still inside. One driver was found to be trapped inside the vehicle. Sadly, the crash did turn into a fatality. Members of the CRAFT team came to assist with diagrams and measurements. Detective Gilliam was called in to investigate. Under the circumstances, Officer Hutchinson, Officer Herkamp and Detective Gilliam did a great job on a very stressful case.

April 12, 2021 - Monday

Officer Hutchinson and Officer Graves responded to a suicidal subject at the Webster Ridge Apts. She had made some suicidal statements and then left. It was later discovered the subject had been at Kaiser Hospital, but she did not wait around to speak to anyone. Later in the evening, Officer Lau and Officer Day made contact with the subject. She was found to be fine and had been with family. This was good follow up and team work by officers to make sure a citizen was indeed ok.

April 13, 2021 - Tuesday

Sergeant Leake and Officer Olson responded to a shoplift at Hollywood Beverage where a male was reported to have walked in and stolen two bottles of liquor. The male was not found on an area check. About 30 minutes later, Hollywood Beverage called in to report the same male had come back and stolen another bottle of liquor from the store. An extensive area check was performed but the subject was not found. About 2 hours later, officers were dispatched to assist Gladstone Fire on a report of a male who had set a garbage can on fire at the Tall Oaks Apartments. Sergeant Leake saw a male who matched the description of the shoplifter running from the direction of the fire. The male was told to stop and complied. April 19, 2021 - Monday

Lieutenant Gerkman came upon a U-Haul truck that was partially blocking the street near Bellevue/Arlington. Gerkman tried to contact the business owner but was unable to make contact. The vehicle was a hazard to the morning commute so a tow was ordered.

April 21, 2021 - Wednesday

Officer Olson and Reserve Officer Hale were on foot patrol near Cross Park when they saw a male and female get into a physical altercation. The officers saw the female punch the male several times in the face and then saw the male hit the female. The female was taken into custody. The male left the scene and was later found by cover officers. A fight ensued with the suspect as he resisted arrest. Both subjects were lodged at CCJ for DV related crimes, and the male was lodged on a felony warrant, Dis Con II, interfering with a Peace Officer and Resisting Arrest.
