This month GPD Patrol Officers responded to several Code Enforcement related incidents:

- 54 Parking Complaints
- 2 Abandoned Vehicles
- 16 Animal Complaints
- 12 Noise Complaints
- 122 Premise Checks

The patrol officers are assisting Code Enforcement by addressing issues as they come into contact with them.

This month our parking complaints doubled as officers began doing parking patrol at Meldrum Bar Park. For most of the month, officers were giving warnings to park users, allowing a grace period. Another reason for the increase is due to the hot weather, High Rocks has become very popular. Officers are enforcing parking laws around the High Rocks area.

Abandoned vehicles decreased quite a bit as citizens are getting better educated about parking their vehicles.

We had one animal complaint this month. A dog was found wandering near Hereford and Portland Avenue with no collar and no ID chip detected. The dog was taken to Dog Services to be housed.

Officers have added premise checks to their proactive events and this relates to code enforcement as they are checking vacant houses, parks, businesses and other areas that need increased presence. They are also using this incident type for checks at Meldrum Bar Park for parking enforcement.

K9 Nanuk is a four-and-a-half-year-old German Shepherd born in Slovakia. At seven weeks old K9 Nanuk was sold to a man in Germany who started training K9 Nanuk. In Germany in order to breed a dog they must achieve a sport title. In Germany the primary sport is schutzhund. schutzhund training is comprised of three separate parts, they are obedience, tracking, and protection work. You can accomplish three levels of titles from this training. K9 Nanuk was imprinted with the beginning knowledge in schutzhund training however he was sold at a young age and he had not achieved a title. Most working dogs are sold to kennels where police agencies purchase them with some sport dog training up to titled dogs in sport training. The training is then adapted to police work.

7/4 An extremely intoxicated subject refused to leave Gaffer's Pub after getting into a fight with her brother who left before the police arrived. The subject became belligerent with police and had to be handcuffed before an ambulance arrived to take her to a hospital as she was too drunk to care for herself.

7/6 A pedestrian was struck by a truck on W Arlington St near 99E. The pedestrian was darting between stopped cars at the light and did not know there was a second lane. There was no way the truck could have avoided the crash. The pedestrian was at fault.

7/7 An overdose death occurred. Assistance from the Medical Examiner's office and Clackamas County Sherriff's office was utilized.

7/14 Officer stopped to check on a car parked on River Rd at 2am. The car was driven by two ladies and they had a flat tire. The officer finished changing the tire for them so they could be on their way.

7/21 Just after 2am the Holiday Inn reported a subject called in a fake noise complaint and while the front desk employee was away checking on the complaint a subject jumped the counter and stole cash, about \$41.00. 30 minutes prior a similar incident happened in Wilsonville. Officers were able to confirm the same subject committed both crimes. Leads are being followed to locate the suspect.

7/26 A traffic crash happened on Webster Rd near Charolais Dr. A car slowly pulled out into the street to look around parked cars. An SUV driving south clipped the front of the car as it pulled into the lane. The SUV flipped onto its top and slid to a stop. Several citizens ran to help and smashed out the driver window to help get the driver out before police arrived. The driver was transported to the hospital as a precaution.

7/30 Officer stopped a truck for speeding on Glen Echo Ave. The truck had no license plates. The officer was able to determine the truck was stolen and was quickly able to secure it so the driver could not flee. The driver was arrested. A search of the vehicle found over a dozen pieces of foil used to smoke heroin and pills. Meth, Heroin, and illegal pills were located in the driver's belongings. The driver was lodged at jail and the vehicle was returned to its owner.

An officer stopped a car that continued to its driveway. After the officer identified the driver and returned to his vehicle to run the subject the driver and the passengers all jumped out of the car. The driver ran around to the back of the house and hid. Other officers arrived and were able to locate the hiding driver and take her into custody. The driver had a warrant for DUII and was DUII tonight. Officers conducted an investigation and the driver was charged with Elude in a vehicle, Elude on foot, and DUII. She had a BAC of .22%

### July 1, 2021- Thursday

Officers received a report of an elderly subject that was believed to be deceased. Officers responded to the scene and conducted a death investigation. No foul play was suspected.

### July 2, 2021- Friday

A day shift officer received a child welfare cross report, which was investigated and documented. It is normal for Gladstone Police Department officers to investigate several child welfare cross reports every week. Many of these reports are made to Oregon Department of Human Services- Child Welfare (DHS) by mandatory reporters such as teachers, counselors, and health care providers. Any time there is suspicion of abuse or neglect, or an otherwise unexplained injury to a child, a report must be made, and investigated. Any time law enforcement officers receive reports of abuse or neglect, those reports are also required to be cross-reported to DHS.

Clackamas County Sheriff's Office deputies received a report of a possible impaired driver near SE Webster Rd./ SE Thiessen Rd., in Milwaukie. The driver was reported to be traveling southbound on Webster Rd. The driver ended up on foot in the area of Webster Rd./ Oatfield Rd. Gladstone Police Department officers were able to contact the driver near Kearn's Market. The driver was determined to be impaired. As officers attempted to take the driver into custody, the adult female driver became combative and kicked a Gladstone Police Department officer. The driver was taken into custody without anyone receiving any injuries.

Gladstone Fire Department and American Medical Response were dispatched to a report of a 33 year-old that was not conscious and was not breathing in the 400 block of W. Clarendon St., in Gladstone. Officer arrived at the scene at the same time as fire/ EMS units. Officers assisted as resuscitative efforts were performed. After performing CPR for approximately 30 minutes, the police/ fire/ EMS personnel that worked together were able to detect a pulse on the patient. The patient was transported to a local hospital for emergency medical care. A Gladstone Police Department Chaplain was contacted to assist the family with this very traumatic experience. Excellent work by everyone involved!

### July 3, 2021- Saturday

During the holiday weekend, several officers spent time focusing on traffic enforcement. Multiple citations and warnings were given. There are many streets in Gladstone where community members have requested extra patrols as drivers have been observed speeding. As

these complaints are received, officers are strategizing on the best tactics to achieve driver compliance, and increased traffic safety.

### July 4, 2021- Sunday

Officers responded to a report of a disturbance in the 900 block of Yale Ave. The reporting party believed they had heard a gunshot. Officers responded and contacted one of the involved parties. It was confirmed by statements and video surveillance that a firearm had been fired. A Gladstone Police Department detective was briefed on the incident, and assigned to follow-up on the case. The investigation is ongoing. Many of the involved subjects have been identified. The case will be referred to the appropriate authorities for prosecution, once the investigation is concluded.

### July 7, 2021- Wednesday

Officers were dispatched to a report of a 41-year-old male subject who had overdosed and passed. Gladstone Police Department officers, a Gladstone Police Department detective, Clackamas County Sheriff's Office Interagency Narcotics Task Force detectives, and the Clackamas County Medical Examiner's Office responded to the scene. The investigation is ongoing. Supervisors of the Clackamas County Sheriff's Office Interagency Narcotics Task Force indicated that there has been an influx of drug-related deaths in Clackamas County; believed to be related to an increase of fentanyl in the area.

### July 9, 2021- Friday

Agency Assist- Burglary- Tonkin Chrysler- Jeep- Dodge- Ram- Fiat—Clackamas County Sheriff's Office deputies received a report from a janitorial service employee that a subject had broken in to the auto dealership. As deputies were arriving, they could see the suspect inside. A patrol K9 was deployed. The suspect was able to be detained. It was initially believed that there may be multiple suspects in the building. Clackamas County Sheriff's Office deputies requested additional officers from neighboring



agencies to assist in containing and searching the very large commercial building. Several

Gladstone Police Department officers responded to assist. It is critical for the law enforcement agencies in Clackamas County to work together to keep each other and out communities safe.

### July 16, 2021- Friday

Officers responded to an assault at the Safeway store. The victim complained of chest pain, so medical personnel were summoned to the scene. The suspect had left the location on foot prior to Gladstone Police Department officer's arrival. The suspect was identified and contact was attempted at their residence on two separate occasions, but the suspect did not appear to be home. The case remains under investigation, and efforts are continuing to locate and interview the suspect.

### July 21, 2021- Wednesday

Officers responded to a head-on traffic crash in the area of E. Arlington St./ Harvard Ave. Witnesses reported the driver of one of the vehicles driving at a high rate of speed prior to the collision. An occupant of the vehicle that was struck by the speeding vehicle was injured, and was transported to a local hospital for treatment. The driver that was suspected of driving at a high rate of speed and that crossed the center line and struck the vehicle head-on was arrested for reckless driving.

### July 23, 2021- Friday

Clackamas County Communications received a report of a possible deceased body in the Clackamas River, near Dahl Beach. Officers and a detective responded to the scene. Clackamas County Sheriff's Office Marine Patrol and Dive/ Rescue, and Clackamas County Medical Examiner's Office units responded and recovered the body. Gladstone Police Department personnel assisted with scene security, and later determined that the recovered body was associated with a Gladstone missing person investigation.

A Gladstone Police Department officer noticed a fire in the trees/ fence line between Tonkin Kia and the Red, White, and Blue store on McLoughlin Blvd. Officers used several fire extinguishers to nearly extinguish the fire. Clackamas Fire- Engine E315 responded and used water to ensure the fire was completely out. Several vehicles were damaged at the Tonkin Kia lot. An investigation is underway to determine the origin and cause of the fire. Great work by the initial responding officer who was alert to their surroundings and took prompt action with the fire extinguisher from his patrol vehicle to get the fire knocked down. There is no question that the officer's quick actions minimized damages to vehicles, and possibly building in the area.



Officer Clement Lau & Reserve Officer Tyler Hale responded to a CPR/ assist fire call. Upon arrival, they began chest compressions and then assisted when the fire department/ EMS personnel arrived. The patient was able to be resuscitated and was transported to a hospital for advanced medical care. Great job, Officer Lau and Reserve Officer Hale.

### July 28, 2021- Wednesday

Officers participated in firearms training, in Canby. Officers focus on use-of-force decision making, and the safe use of department-issued handguns and rifles.

### **07-02-21**

Officers responded to Safeway, regarding counterfeit money that was passed equaling \$600. During inspection of the money, there were only 7 serial numbers on the 30 bills. Officers found these same serial numbers had been used in several cases around Clackamas and Washington Counties, including West Linn, Canby, Sherwood and Tigard. A suspect has been identified, and has been tied to a large nationwide forgery/counterfeiting case.

### **07-09-21**

Officers responded to a shoplift in progress at Safeway and contacted the suspect who was pushing a full shopping cart of merchandise out the front door without paying. The suspect He was identified and had a felony warrant. The passenger gave his own name and was found to have 2 warrants.

### **07-15-21**

Officers responded to a welfare check at a residence on Edgewater Rd where it was reported a female was screaming that she needed medical attention. Fire and medical arrived first and found an intoxicated female without any serious injuries. Police arrived and developed reasonable suspicion that a domestic violence incident had occurred. The female was transported to hospital for medical treatment.

Officers attempted to stop a subject on his bicycle riding at 11:26pm without lights on his bike. The subject had ridden through an intersection in front of cars without stopping or yielding the right of way and was almost hit. Officers explained that he was being stopped for fail to use headlight and fail to maintain lane. The male admitted he had a felony warrant.

### **07-22-21**

Officers were dispatched to a stolen vehicle call from the River Place Apartments. The vehicle was parked at the location about an hour and a half earlier. While Officers were taking the information, Canby PD was on a traffic stop with the stolen vehicle. Officers informed Canby PD the vehicle was stolen and the subjects were taken into custody.

Officers took a stolen vehicle report at the Tall Oaks Apts. The reporting party said she and her daughter had just gotten home. They were driving the vehicle back from California. They had

been home for only about 30 minutes when the 2000 Honda Civic was stolen. There is no suspect info in this case.

### **07-23-21**

Officers responded to the report of a body found in the Clackamas River just under Hwy 99. The reporting party was snorkeling and diving in the area and found what looked like a body in about 12-16 feet of water. Divers were called out and confirmed it was a human body. The medical examiner was called to the scene and the body was recovered.

### **07-24-21**

Officers made a traffic stop on a speeding vehicle traveling 62 mph in a 40 mph zone on McLoughlin at 1:25 am. The male driver had an odor of alcohol. A DUII investigation ensued and the male was arrested and processed. He blew a .19 BAC. He was cited and driven home.

Officers took a stolen vehicle report at a women's transitional house on Park Way. A resident took the keys without permission. Another resident's credit card was also stolen, and was used at two different locations.

### **07-28-21**

Officers took a criminal mischief report at the high school. Video showed three hooded juveniles approach a window near the back of the school. The threw a baseball, breaking the window. Video shows the juveniles running away afterward. They all had on hoodies with facemasks and identities were impossible to determine.

Officers took a stolen vehicle report from a victim at Vogie's Bar. The victim parked his truck in the parking lot and came out a few hours later and his truck was gone. The victim reported that he had a firearm in the truck. The truck and firearm were both entered into LEDS/NCIC as stolen. There was no suspect info.

### **07-29-21**

Officers responded to a missing person who was reported to be at Stanley's Bar. The male was reported to have dementia issues and had left his assisted living facility several days ago in Lake Oswego. The male was found in good shape. He wanted to go home but could not remember where he lived. Officers transported him to his home in Lake Oswego.

### **07-30-21**

Officers responded to a report of a strong arm robbery at Safeway. It was reported a suspect assaulted a cashier and left the scene with property. Officers were able to find the suspect hiding behind some vehicles near Latus Motors and the suspect was taken into custody.

Officers were doing traffic patrol on Glen Echo and stopped a vehicle for speeding. The vehicle was a reported stolen and the suspect taken into custody. Several citations were issued.

Officers attempted a traffic stop on a vehicle near Abernethy and Center St for expired tags. The driver failed to yield and continued driving at about 20-25 mph while waving out the window. The driver drove to her home and exited her vehicle. While the officer was running information from his vehicle computer, the driver ran away. Officers called for backup and they began knocking on her door. Her 17-year-old daughter came outside and said mom was not at home. Officers looked around the yard and found the suspect hiding in an open crawlspace. She was arrested for felony elude in a vehicle, misdemeanor elude on foot, DUII and reckless endangerment. She was processed for DUII and found to have a BAC of .22%.

### **07-31-21**

Officers responded to assist Oregon City PD as they found two vehicles parked in the bushes near the cove on Main Street. Both vehicles were reported stolen and Officers did a search for the subjects. Information from citizens came in that the 3-4 males wearing all black had gotten into a U-Haul van driven by a white female. Officers found the U-Haul van and a traffic stop was conducted for an equipment violation. The suspects were hiding in the back of the U-Haul lying under a tarp. They admitted to being in possession of the stolen vehicles and were ultimately cited and released. One subject went to jail on a felony warrant.
