June 2021

Greetings,

Although traffic safety and emergency preparedness continues to be a priority for the police department, there was an emphasis placed on these two areas during the month of June. First I want to talk about traffic safety. The police department receives many complaints regarding speeding vehicles in our neighborhoods. Finding ways to slow vehicles down when traveling through neighborhoods can be difficult at times and requires personal accountability amongst the drivers and a partnership between the police department and its community.

I had the great opportunity to meet with community members regarding speeding vehicles this month. During the meeting we strengthened the partnerships between the police and community in hopes of developing a "slow down campaign" throughout the city. I was excited to see their enthusiasm and hear their ideas as we worked towards a safer Gladstone. The police department has also partnered with ODOT to help with signage to place in yards for both pedestrian safety and speed reduction. You will see many signs in and around neighborhoods in yards asking drivers to slow and allow pedestrians to cross, great community effort!

The police department is also in the process of capturing vehicle data that includes average speeds on our city streets, vehicle counts, individual speeds, day and time of speeds, etc. After collecting the data, ODOT is conducting an analysis of the data which provides officers days of the week and times of when violations occur. The police department is currently using this data to help with enforcement. We will continue to capture data throughout the summer to help us be in the right area at the right time. Our priority is to change behavior and to slow vehicles down. If you speed through our neighborhoods and you are caught, you will be ticketed. Drive the speed limit for overall community safety!

The city has also purchased and received a new speed trailer. This trailer has the ability to message along with capture speeds and collects data. Over the next month you will see this equipment on our city streets often.

The other area of emphasis this month was emergency preparedness. The Fire Chief and I have worked diligently with both GEMS (Gladstone Emergency Management Support) and CERT on areas where we noticed gaps during recent emergency events. Both groups of dedicated volunteers were instrumental in helping open the cooling center when temperatures were over 100 degrees. The city has received a few volunteer applications from community members but we can use more. Please consider volunteering with the city to help fellow community members during a time of need. Go to the city's website for an application.

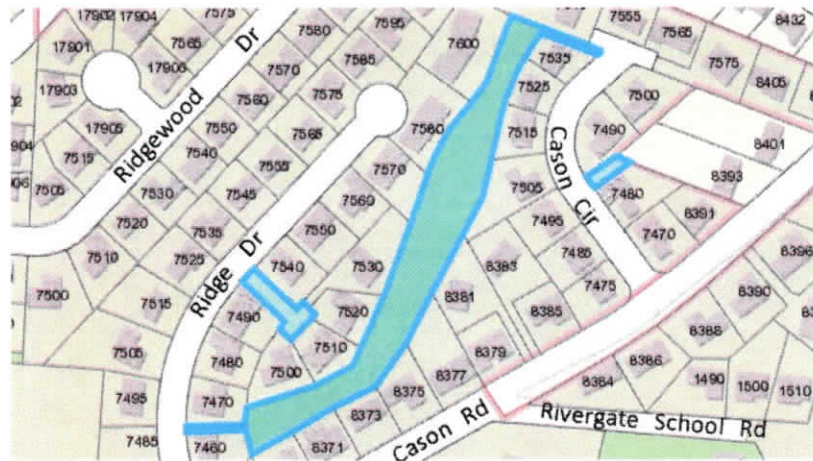


400 Block Collins Crest – Complaint about overgrown vegetation and garbage on the property. Owner responded immediately and corrected the violations.

100 Block W Arlington Street – Complaint about overgrown vegetation and civil issue about trespassing related to a neighbor installing a pool on the property without property owner’s permission.

CASE UPDATES

1600 Block Harvard Avenue – Continuing to work with property owner to get into compliance. Three junk vehicles and 3 trailer loads of junk have been removed from the property. Photos document progress. Ongoing weekly progress checks are being conducted. Case pending.



100 Block E Clackamas Blvd. – Property owner’s attorney has started the eviction process for illegal occupation of a shed. Garbage has been removed and work has begun to remove junk from the property. Case pending.

82nd Drive / Edgewater Road – Met with UPRR onsite and developed an action plan to get into compliance to remove the overgrown vegetation. Fencing that previously obstructed sidewalk has been removed. Case pending.

This month GPD Patrol Officers responded to several Code Enforcement related incidents:

- 62 Parking Complaints
- 14 Animal Complaints
- 4 Abandoned Vehicles
- 9 Noise Complaints

Parking complaints skyrocketed this month due to the hot weather. Vehicles parked around High Rocks Park are parked illegally and reported more by citizens who are affected by this. Also the Meldrum Bar Park fee was enacted and officers were conducting parking enforcement during very busy times in the park.

Police officers have recently taken over resolving most of the vehicle related code calls to free up the Code Enforcement Officer to conduct more in depth code investigations.

Animal complaints were up slightly this month. Noise complaints were also up a little bit. We are seeing more activity in the community with the release of restrictions due to Covid 19.

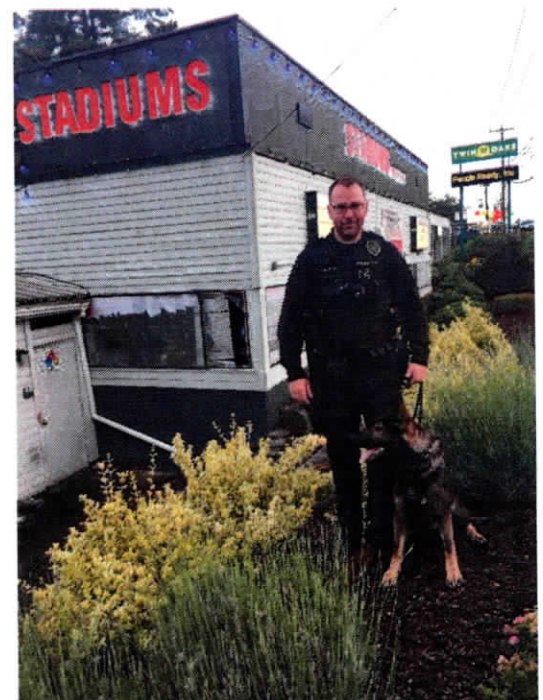
K9 Nanuk is a four-and-a-half-year-old German Shepherd born in Slovakia. At seven weeks old K9 Nanuk was sold to a man in Germany who started training K9 Nanuk. In Germany in order to breed a dog they must achieve a sport title. In Germany the primary sport is schutzhund. schutzhund training is comprised of three separate parts, they are obedience, tracking, and protection work. You can accomplish three levels of titles from this training. K9 Nanuk was imprinted with the beginning knowledge in schutzhund training however he was sold at a young age and he had not achieved a title. Most working dogs are sold to kennels where police agencies purchase them with some sport dog training up to titled dogs in sport training. The training is then adapted to police work.

6/16 A vehicle was stopped for going 44MPH on E Dartmouth St (25MPH zone). The driver had been drinking and was arrested for DUII. A blood draw was done as the subject refused to submit a breath test.

6/27 112-degree record heat! All river access in the city was extremely busy.

A subject was found deceased in his trailer at a mobile home park. The trailer did not have A/C.

4 wanted subjects were contacted today. 3 had cite and release warrants and 1 was transported to jail.

6/28 116-degrees! Another new record! River access still very busy. Many parking tickets issued on the streets in the area of High Rocks Park.

GPD assisted OCPD on their side of the Clackamas River near High Rocks. There was a large disturbance and two subject had facial injuries. No one wanted to talk to the police about what happened. One subject was transported to a hospital.

6/29 Still hot but no records. Sadly, another death was reported this time at an apartment that did not have A/C. It is unknown if this death was heat related.

While working ODOT traffic grant an officer stopped a car for several violations near High Rocks Park. The driver had a warrant and the car turned out to be stolen.

June 2, 2021- Wednesday

Officers responded to two theft calls at Safeway, as well as an adult subject attempting to purchase alcohol for a minor. After being confronted by a Safeway asset protection employee, the subjects left the store and went to High Rocks Park. The subjects were contacted in the park, in possession of alcohol. The subjects were trespassed from the park.

June 3, 2021- Thursday

At approximately 18:15, officers responded to a report of a domestic disturbance with a weapon (knife) at an apartment complex near W. Hereford St./ Portland Ave. All involved parties were contacted and it was determined to be a verbal disturbance between a father and son. No weapons were involved.

At approximately 19:15, officers responded to a train incident where an adult female was hit by an Amtrak train near the Edgewater Rd. rail crossing. Initially, the woman was unable to be located but after a search of the area, the injured woman was located in the back yard of a nearby residence. Clackamas County Sheriff's Office, Clackamas Fire, American Medical Response, Union Pacific Railroad Police and Amtrak Police all assisted at the scene, and with the investigation. The train track trespasser was transported to a local hospital for diagnosis and treatment. The case was referred to the Gladstone City Prosecutor for consideration of charges for trespassing.



A report of a domestic disturbance was investigated on River Rd. The suspect had left the scene, but the investigating officer was able to determine that the suspect was associated with a house on Patricia Dr. The officer was able to contact the suspect who was taken into custody

for strangulation and other domestic violence crimes. The suspect was transported to the Clackamas County Jail where they were booked and lodged.

June 5, 2021- Saturday Meldrum Bar Park, Dahl Beach Park, High Rocks Park, and Cross Park have all been busy with a lot of visitors. Officers have been diligently working on extra patrols through the parks, to ensure they are a safe place for all.

June 7, 2021- Monday

In the early morning hours on June 7th, Clackamas County Major Crimes Team was activated to assist with the investigation of an officer-involved shooting incident that occurred in Happy Valley. A Gladstone Police Department detective responded and co-lead the investigation with the Clackamas County Sheriff's Office. On these critical incidence, the multi-agency team assists each other with personnel and resources. When the Gladstone community needs assistance with a complex investigation, these personnel and resources are available to assist the Gladstone Police Department investigators. Homicides. Officer-involved incidents, and suspicious deaths can be very time consuming, and it is great to be able to join forces and work together to do our best work on these cases; to provide the best service to our citizens, and the citizens of Clackamas County.

June 9, 2021- Wednesday

Early on June 9th, Gladstone Police Department detectives, with the assistance of Oregon City Police Department, Sandy Police Department, and Clackamas County Sheriff's Office detective, served a search warrant at a residence. The homeowner is being investigated for crimes related to possession of child pornography. During the search warrant, several evidence items were seized. The investigation in ongoing.

At 17:00, officers were dispatched to a report of a motor vehicle striking a pedestrian (child) in the area of E. Gloucester St./ Union Ave. It was determined that the driver had veered off of the roadway and on to the sidewalk, striking the approximately one year-old child that was riding a scooter on the sidewalk. The driver was arrested (cited & released) for reckless driving and reckless endangering). Fortunately, the young child did not sustain serious/ life-threatening injuries. With the help of Gladstone Police Department Chaplains, we were able to get the child a new scooter and a helmet.



June 10, 2021- Thursday

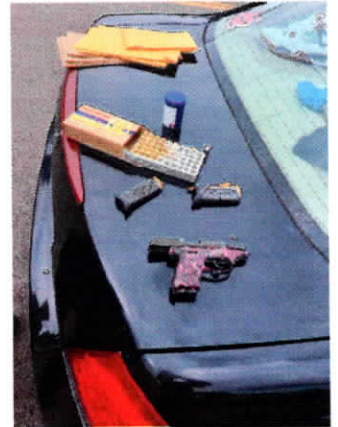
Gladstone Police Department officers have been spending many hours every week focusing on traffic safety in our community. With grants funds available for speed enforcement, seat belt enforcement, DUII enforcement, pedestrian safety enforcement, and distracted driving enforcement, officers have been coming in early, staying late, and coming in on their days off to work to keep the Gladstone community safe through enhanced enforcement.

June 14, 2021- Monday

A pedestrian safety traffic detail was completed at the intersection of E. Arlington St./ Harvard Ave. Officers stopped over 20 vehicles in about 3 ½ hours, for multiple violations, but primarily for failing to stop for pedestrians either in the crosswalk, or waiting to cross at a crosswalk. Multiple citations and warnings were issued. Educational materials about pedestrian safety was provided to drivers. One driver was arrested after it was discovered they were in possession of a stolen handgun.



June 18, 2021- Friday

There was a flag wave event in Oregon City, just outside of Gladstone. Two Gladstone officers were assigned to assist at the event. Additional Gladstone Police Department personnel were prepared to respond to assist Oregon City Police Department, if requested. The event drew counter-protesters and a conflict ensued, leading Oregon City Police Department to declare a riot and the crowds being ordered to disperse. After approximately an hour of clashing between the groups, most of the involved people had dispersed and left the area.



June 19th, 2021- Saturday

A citizen called to report finding a leg (prosthetic) near the road in the area of E. Arlington St./ Cornell Ave. The leg was seized as found property and through the diligent work of the Gladstone Police Department Property/ Evidence Tech., the owner was able to be located.

June 23, 2021- Wednesday

At about 16:55, officer received a report of a menacing/ theft/ robbery that had just occurred at the Kearns Market. The suspect vehicle description was broadcast, and was recognized by several officers. The suspect had pulled a black gun, which was later determined to have been an air pistol, and pointed it at a store employee. The suspect fled the scene, but was later involved in a rollover crash in Clackamas. The suspect was detained, and later arrested for Robbery II, Menacing, Theft III, Violation of Restraining Order, and Criminal Mischief III. The VRO and Criminal Mischief charges were related to a prior incident.

June 30, 2021- Wednesday

Several officers spent time conducting extra patrols/ traffic enforcement on Abernethy Ln., after a citizen made a complaint about speeding drivers. Several drivers were stopped. Officers will be continuing the increased patrols in this area, as well as the areas throughout Gladstone where there have been increased complaints of speeding drivers.

Officers took a report of a Bias Incident where a citizen had hung an Israel flag in her front window. She arrived home to find two pictures in her yard. One picture said "F*** You Israel" and another had an image of the Jewish Star with a line through it. There was no suspect info and the victim's neighbors did not have cameras to capture the incident.

06-03-2021

At about 7:15 pm Officers were dispatched to a pedestrian hit by a train near 82nd Drive and Edgewater. A female had been hit with a glancing blow from an Amtrak train and had survived. She was not immediately at the scene as she had walked to a neighbors' house for help. She was found by medical staff and then transported to the hospital for treatment.

06-05-21

Officers took a report of a theft of a firearm at High Rocks Park. The RP said he had his handgun in his backpack with a towel and other items. He said he left his pack with family while he was swimming. He said that when he got home his gun was missing. He waited to report to see if one of his family members had taken his gun for safekeeping. There was no suspect info.

06-09-21

Officers responded to an injury crash involving a vehicle hitting a toddler on the sidewalk on E Gloucester. The female driver left the roadway while traveling westbound on Gloucester and hit a toddler on a scooter, with father present, as they walked. The female driver stopped and was cooperative with the investigation. There was no impairment noticed during the contact with the driver. She was charged with reckless endangering and reckless driving. The child was transported to hospital but was discharged a short time later with no injuries. Chaplains purchased the child a new scooter as the one from the accident was considered evidence.

06-12-21

Officers were dispatched to a welfare check on a male passed out in a lawn chair. The male was found sitting in a lawn chair, with a shaved head with a Mohawk, button shirt and blue jeans. He was found to have warrants possession of meth and was cited with a new court date.

06-18-21

Today was a very busy day with several events happening. In the evening, Gladstone High School Seniors were graduating. SRO Graves was leading this event with other Officers assisting. Portland Avenue was closed from Nelson to Abernethy to give the kids a huge celebration area for their graduation. The event was a success.

At the same time, Antifa and Patriots had set up a rally in Oregon City at the Oregon City Shopping Center area. OCPD asked for assistance and all Clackamas County agencies responded by sending officers to help. Things got out of hand and fights broke out around Clackamette Park and on Hwy 99E. The event was immediately shut down and crowds were dispersed. Hwy 99 had to be shut down for a short period. The area calmed down and cleared up around 6pm.
