BIAS REPORTING

During the late hours of October 12, 2020 an unknown person spray painted/tagged 4 building on Portland Avenue. The tags included "Black Lives Matter" and some anti-police slogans. Some video from area businesses captured the images of the suspect and that video was released on social media for tips from the public. The case was forwarded to investigations for follow-up. The case remains under investigation as of 10/30/2020 and no leads have been generated at this time.

Possible Bias Event During the early morning hours of October 20, 2020 the front window of Happy Rock Coffee was broken out. This business had a "Black Lives Matter" sign displayed in the window. While there is no evidence at this time to suspect it was a bias crime and it does not meet the definition of Bias Crime (O.R.S. 166.155), it is possible the vandalism was related to the sign. If/when additional evidence or suspects are located, those questions may be answered. This case has been forwarded to investigations for follow-up. The case remains under investigation as of 10/30/2020.

During the nighttime hours of 10/27/2020 into the early morning hours of 10/28/2020 the Senior Center and a nearby private business were the victims of tagging. The word "PITFALL" was tagged in several places.

As a reminder, with the holiday's approaching it is a good time to remember to check on neighbors, particularly those that are elderly or in poor health. Some residents will have packages delivered to their homes. Car break-ins increase and livability crimes and disorder can increase. Get to know each other, look out for one another and call the non-emergency number (or emergency number if appropriate) if you see anything suspicious or unusual that needs to be checked out.

October was a busy month with a lot of focus on the Leaf Pickup Program. Over the last 5 years we have been receiving a substantial increase in the number of complaints related to residents putting leaves out in the street to far in advance of their scheduled leaf pickup. Over the life of the program the city did not enforce leaf pickup guidelines which allowed for residents to put leaves in the street sometimes 4 to 6 weeks before the first scheduled pickup. It was brought to our attention that the City of Gladstone has a responsibility to keep the storm water system free from excessive debris and by allowing the leaves to be placed in the street for an extended period of time potentially violated our storm water permit. In cooperation with Public Works we have launched an enforcement campaign with a focus on educating residents of the importance of not putting leaves out until one week before scheduled pickup times.

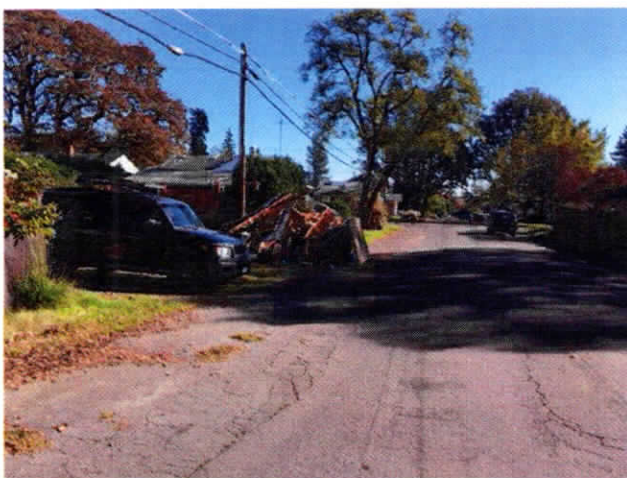

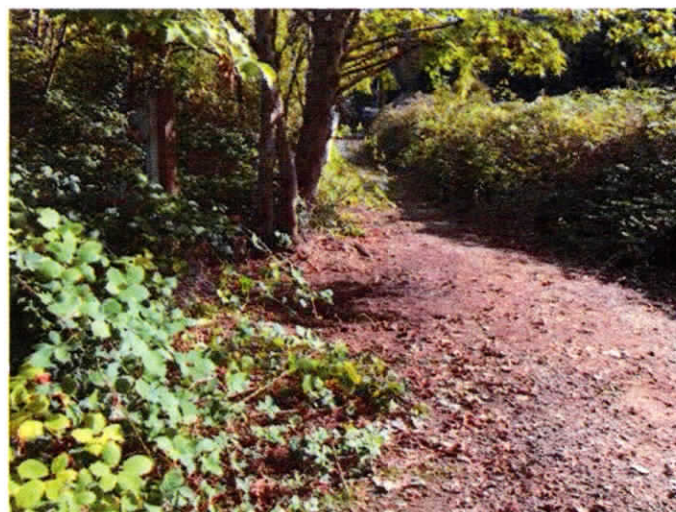
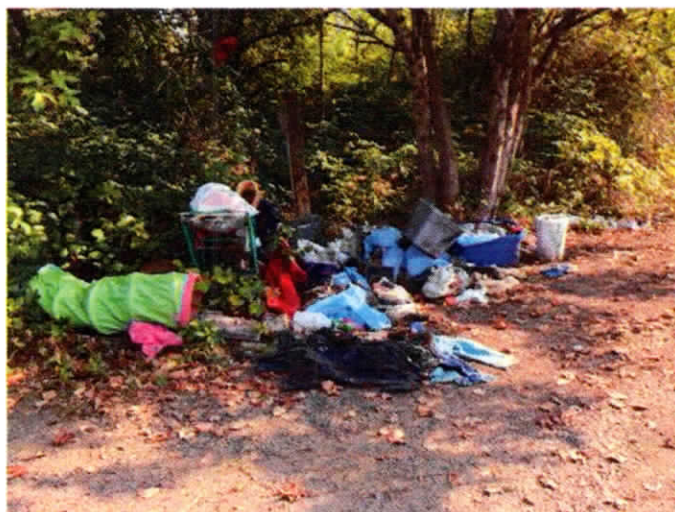

This month GPD Patrol Officers responded to several Code Enforcement related incidents:

- Parking Complaints – 28
- Animal Complaints – 10
- Abandoned Vehicles – 10
- Noise Complaints – 11
- Premise Checks - 256

The abandoned vehicle problem has reduced dramatically with a concerted effort of the officers to tag those vehicles both reported and those that are located. The number of animal complaints decreased to 10 this month from 15 last month.

Parking complaints are back up this month from 14 to 28. Code Enforcement Officer Boyle handled a majority of the calls related to parking complaints this month. See Boyle's monthly report for more details.

Noise complaints were steady until Halloween night where we got 4 calls related to Halloween parties. Officers are spending a good amount of time patrolling the parks, transient camps, vacant buildings and extra patrol through high crime areas.

Officers have added premise checks to their proactive events and this relates to code enforcement as they are checking vacant houses, parks and other areas that need increased presence.

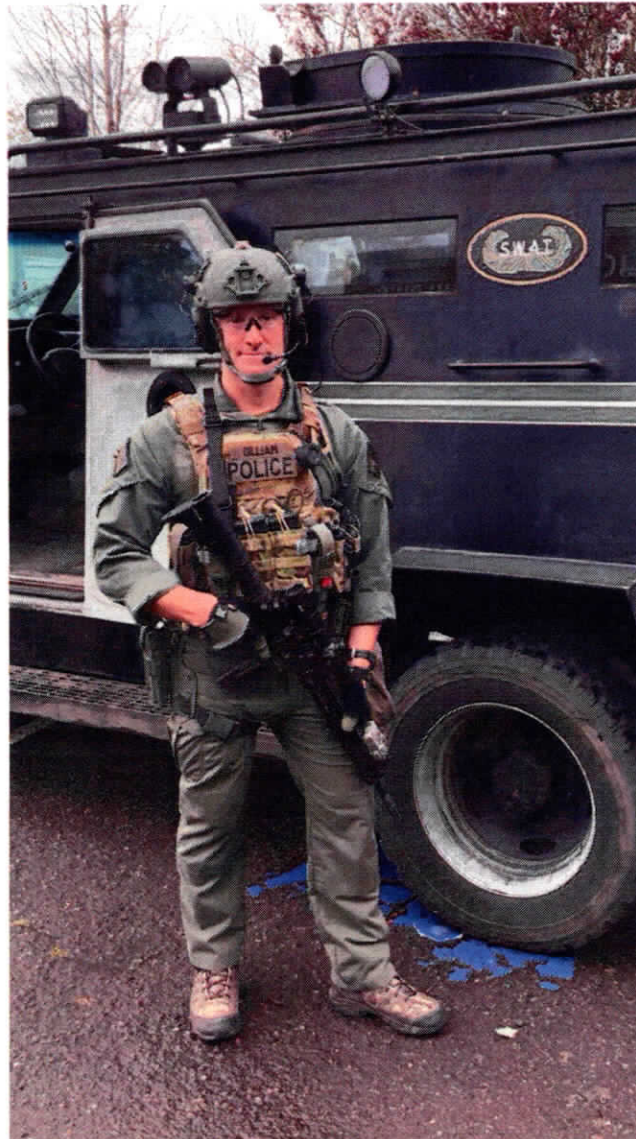

10/1

- Multiple traffic stops resulted in an arrest for DUII and recovery of switches plates. A subject was found having trespassed in a locked dumpster area. The subject refused to identify himself but was eventually identified. He had a felony warrant and was carrying a concealed weapon.

10/2

- A motor home was stopped for traffic violations and the driver refused to identify himself. Officers called for a mobile fingerprint machine and the subject found to have felony warrants. He also had a concealed knife.

10/3

- A subject was found in Meldrum Bar Park at 4am who had a felony warrant.

10/6

- Crash of a vehicle into a bicyclist at McLoughlin Blvd and River Rd. The bicyclist had minor injuries. Officer stopped a vehicle for speeding on Mcloughlin. The vehicle turned out to be stolen and the driver had felony warrants.

10/10

- A subject was located in a vehicle in Meldrum Bar Park just after midnight. The subject had multiple warrants out of Marion and Clackamas Counties.

10/13

- Officers responded to a burglary call and developed a suspect. Within 2 hours they had located a subject matching the description. The suspect confessed to the burglary. Two more burglary reports were taken and evidence at one of the scenes was tied back to the suspect. The suspect has been charged with two of the burglaries.

10/14

- Graffiti was applied to the new FD admin building, post office, old city hall, and Vogie's Bar. No suspect had been identified yet but the case is open.
- Officers located a vehicle in the middle of the road at the entrance to Meldrum Bar Park. Illegal drugs were in plain view in the car. Two subjects in the car were cited and drugs were seized.

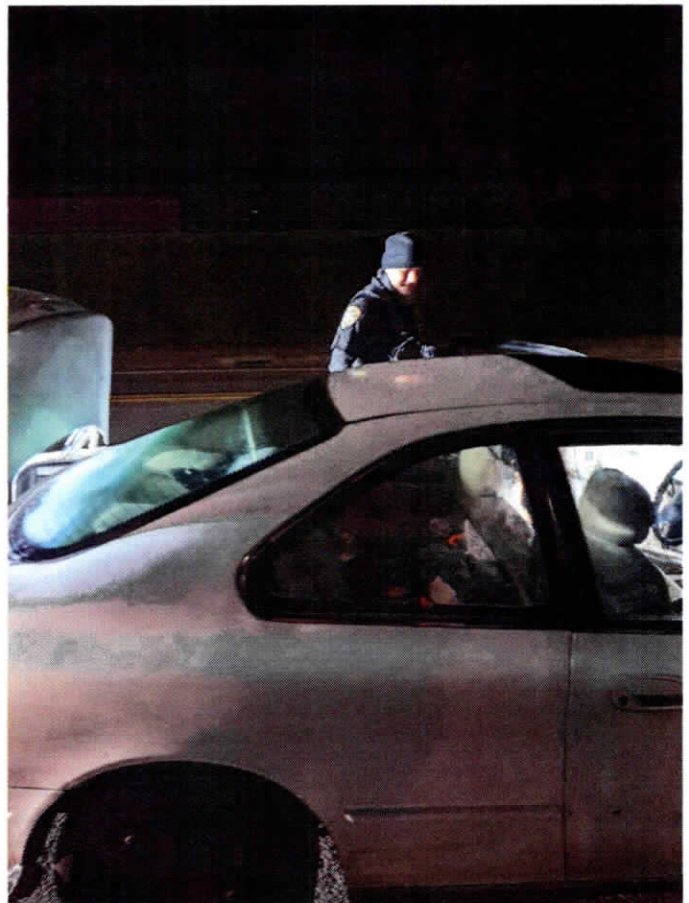
10/15

10/28

- More graffiti found at the Senior Center and across the street at the dental office.

On 10/23/2020 Reserve Officer Hale made a traffic stop on 82nd Dr. The driver had a suspended license, no insurance and no documentation for the vehicle, that he claimed to have just purchased. The vehicle had a trip permit in the window that had been forged. Officer Hale arrested the subject and towed the vehicle. A few days later there was a burglary at the tow lot in Oregon City. The fore mentioned vehicle was the only one entered during the burglary. Oregon City Police Department is working the burglary case.

Patrol Activity

10-03-2020

- Orr and Butler were doing a premise check of Meldrum Bar Park at 0430 hrs and found a vehicle occupied by a male and female near Dahl Beach. The male subject had felony warrants and was arrested. He was also a felon and was in possession of a restricted weapon. He was lodged at CCJ.
- Herkamp was dispatched to a criminal mischief call involving the slashing of vehicle tires in the Sherwood Forest neighborhood. Ultimately roughly 6 vehicles were found to have had tires slashed and 2 other vehicles had been entered. There was no suspect info but the suspect could be related to the earlier prowler call at Los Verdes.

10-04-2020

- Leake, Day, Orr and two CCSO Deputies were called to River Greens Apts for a prowler trying car doors and trying to open exterior garage doors. A male was found after much searching and he was identified as the suspect by several witnesses. Orr and Day collected statements from residents, property maintenance and private security on the property and developed PC to arrest the male for trespassing. He was given a citation and moved along.

10-05-2020

- Orr and Butler were dispatched to a suspicious vehicle at the Holiday Inn. A customer called about a truck parked in the back parking lot idling. The occupants were contacted and the male lied about his identity. He found the subject and ran him and found he had a felony warrant. Butler found an illegal weapon on the male and he was charged with that as well, being a felon. The male was lodged at CCJ.

10-06-2020

- Day made a traffic stop on a vehicle missing a headlight. The driver turned out to be DWS, had a felony warrant and the Kansas plated vehicle was reported stolen. Details gained from the cooperative driver seem like he was duped into buying the vehicle as it was not reported stolen for about a month after going missing. The driver said he bought the vehicle and had some proof of this. He was cited for driving violations and lodged in jail on his felony warrant. The vehicle was towed and recovered.
- Leake made a traffic stop on a vehicle that was missing a headlight. The female driver was DWS and had a cite and release misdemeanor warrant from Yamhill County. The female was cooperative and truthful and was released at the scene.

- Olson was on his way back from Gresham where he was helping instruct at the K9 Academy being taught and was behind a suspected DUII. Olson made the stop in Gladstone and Orr and Day covered him. Day took over the call and did a DUII investigation which yielded the subject having a BAC of .25. This was a great team effort to protect the community.

10-13-2020

- Butler and Orr were dispatched to a burglary where a subject broke a glass door to gain entry into a garage and then was scared off by the homeowner, who chased him with a baseball bat. The suspect was not found on area check. Later another call of a suspicious person came in from the Holiday Inn where a male approached the RP and said he just robbed a house and the homeowner was on meth and was coming after him with a bat. This turned out to be the suspect who broke the window and entered the garage. He was arrested and lodged in jail.
- Day, Olson and Okerman worked a graffiti case where the Post Office, Fire Dept and former City Hall and Police Dept were tagged with derogatory political rhetoric. Some video was secured of the suspect and an investigation is ongoing.

10-16-2020

- Orr was called to a suspicious vehicle parked at 19310 Howell St. He arrived and found a motorcycle that had no plates on it. He ran the VIN and found the vehicle was a reported stolen from Portland. The vehicle was recovered but there was no suspect information.
- Leake made a traffic stop on McLoughlin and Jennings for a speeding violation. The driver turned out to be violation suspended and had a misdemeanor warrant for DUII. The driver was issued several citations and a criminal citation to appear for her warrant.

10-17-2020

- Herkamp and Leake were dispatched to a theft in progress at Walgreen's. It was reported that a male suspect stole a hand basket of electronic items. Herkamp responded to the scene and looked at video. Leake did an area check and with assistance from Transit Police, the suspect was found at the bus stop at McLoughlin and Gloucester. The male had a large black plastic bag with him that held the clothing seen in the video and nearly \$300 worth of merchandise. The suspect was cited for Theft II and for an outstanding warrant for Theft II.

The driver was found parked at Auto Town Buick and had front end damage and a flat front tire. No crash scene could be found after an area check. Hutchinson process the female driver for DUII and she was found to have a .20 BAC.

10-19-2020

- Leake stopped a vehicle at midnight driven by a male who was unable to be identified, based on the information he gave. A female was found hiding under some blankets in the back seat and she was found to have a felony warrant from Multnomah County. The female was taken into custody and the male was detained for fail to carry and present a license. Appropriate citations were issued and the female was transported to jail.

10-20-20

- Hutchinson responded to a criminal mischief at Happy Rock Coffee where employees arrived and found 2 rocks thrown through the windows. There was a Black Lives Matter sign in the window that was broken and it was suspected this may be the motive for the vandalism. A bias incident was filled out for this case 20-022554.

10-24-2020
